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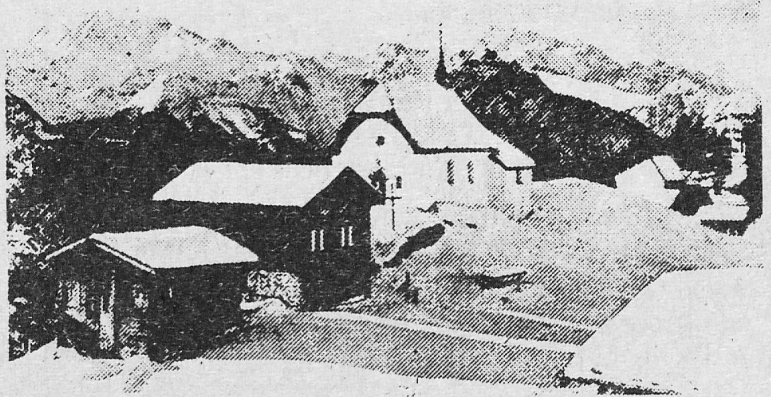

Important Message regarding Swiss Corner

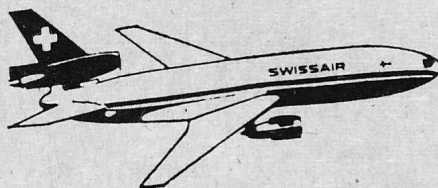

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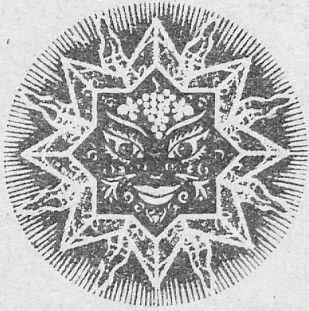

The Taranaki Schwing Club would like to thank all the people who supported us and every special thanks to all the people that helped us. To name everybody would fill a book!!!

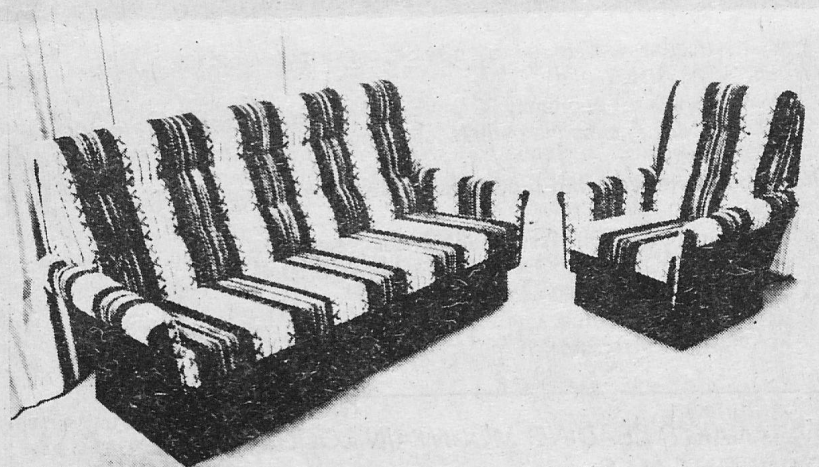

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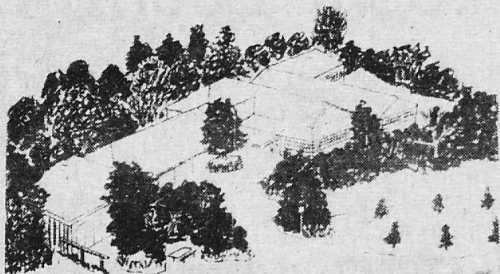
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
