Recipients of the Swiss Review residing in Victoria will by now have received a letter from the Swiss Club of Victoria headed "A New Generation Swiss Club" together with a four page questionnaire.

As most of the readers probably know, the Swiss Club of Victoria has been in existence for many years. We have owned our own Club premises within the Melbourne City boundaries for over three decades.

The Club's motto is to maintain, encourage, display and foster our Swiss heritage. For this noble cause we hope to involve all our Swiss nationals as well as their Australian friends and of course all other nationalities.

Presently, the Club is enjoying one of its highest membership lists ever with over 800 members. At least 55% of our members must be of Swiss origin to comply with the Club's Constitution. Despite this upsurge of membership, the Club's trading results are unsatisfactory. Not that the Club is entirely profit orientated! Unless a surplus is available which can subsequently be re-invested

in the Club resulting in benefits to all members, THE CLUB'S FUTURE IS IN JEOPARDY!

Our hard working Committee and the various sub-committees ensure that, for a very reasonable outlay, members and their friends may re-capture some of the real Swiss atmosphere and "Gemütlichkeit" we may have left behind in our home country.


