Architect and as such worked for well known architectural offices in Zurich, Helsinki, Milano and London.

Initially Signor Broggini came to England to study English, being already fluent in Italian, German and French. Then, motivated by academic interests, he completed a two year post-graduate course at the Architectural Association, School of Architecture in London, where in 1971 he obtained his Diploma in Town and Regional Planning.

A short but intensive professional spell in the Ticino enabled him to work on the formulation of urban design policies for the Borough Plans of Losone and Novazzano. Research interests in Urban and Regional Science brought him back to England, and more specifically to the University of Reading, where sponsored by the British Council and by the Ticino Government he undertook a 3 year research stage under Professor Peter Hall, head of the Geography Department.

Since 1975 Signor Broggini has been working for the Greater
