The Alphornbläser was, to say the least, very impressive. A big thank you to them all.

Mr. Berti, President of the 1st of August Committee, greeted everybody most warmly and thanked His Excellency the Ambassador Mr. F. Ch. Pictet and Madame Pictet for their attendance.

The food was excellent and our thanks to Mr. Baumann of the Swiss Centre and his staff for their efforts. Most of all a *big thank you* to all members of the 1st of August Committee for their hard work on everyone's behalf in order to ensure such an enjoyable evening. We look forward to next year's celebration of our country's National Day.

His Excellency Mr. F. Ch. Pictet, National Day Speech:

Today's anniversary invites every Swiss to set aside for a moment considerations of a personal nature and instead to direct our thoughts towards our common good and our common concern: the state of our country.

I do wish to thank you for your presence here tonight, because it clearly demonstrates your attachment to Switzerland. However strong the ties that unite you to Great Britain, you are reaffirming your Swiss identity, your dedication and commitment to the values that bind together all the Swiss at home and throughout the world.

In the first place I think we should be thankful for the mere fact that we have a country. This is a privilege of which millions and millions of people are at present deprived who live in exile or sit in refugee camps.

It is another privilege to have a country which lives in peace, which is at peace at home and which is spared the tensions, conflicts and divisions that plague so many parts of the world—a prosperous country, too. We do have problems and difficulties but of manageable proportions. Our inflation remains one of the lowest of the world. The same is also true of overall unemployment, even if the figures conceal individual cases of hardship. Above all, there is no doubt or hesitation either about the determination of the authorities at all levels to keep the country on the right track, or about the support they enjoy from the vast majority of the Swiss people. The national consensus is very strong indeed.

This fortunate state of affairs entails, of course, responsibilities. Switzerland must remain, at a time when national egoism is so widespread, a country open to the outside world, generous and compassionate and ready to cooperate with others whenever possible, ready also to alleviate the sufferings of the victims of underdevelopment, violence or armed conflicts. More can and should be done and every Swiss is in a position to do his share.

On this national day commemorating events that happened almost 700 years ago, we should be grateful for the foresight and the wisdom of the people who made our country what it is today. It should also be an occasion on which we renew our commitment to serve the country and to support the ideas it has stood for for such a long time. Finally, I suggest that we also seize this opportunity to express our gratitude to Great Britain, which has for so many of you become a second home.

In this spirit of rejoicing, friendship and gratitude I invite you to say with me "Long live Switzerland!"

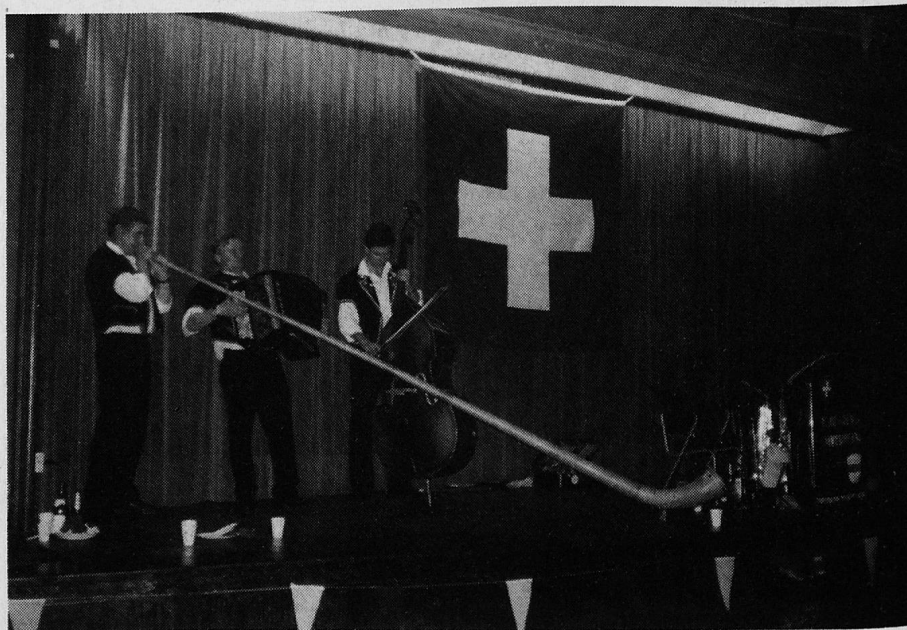
1st August Celebration in Taunton

To Mr. E. Peter Tangemann on being elected President of the Federation of Swiss Societies in the U.K. (FOSSUK).



Mr. Ernst (Peter) Tangemann arrived in London in November 1967, at a time when the Union Bank of Switzerland had just opened its London Branch—its first branch abroad. He began working for UBS in

Geneva, where he stayed for 16 years, and after a brief spell in Zurich, moved to Basel for the period 1964–67. After having headed the Foreign Exchange and Money Market Department, Mr. Tangemann took over as Branch manager in 1972.

Mr. Tangemann has actively participated in the life of the Swiss colony in the U.K. during his residence here. He was President of the City Swiss Club in 1974–75; in 1977 he became a member of the Consistoire of the Eglise Suisse, of which he is now Vice President; he has held the post of Honorary Treasurer to the Anglo-Swiss Society since 1971; he has now been elected to the post of President of the Federation of Swiss Societies in the U.K.

Mr. Tangemann met his wife, Stina, who is Finnish (Swedish-speaking), during his language studies in London in 1948. They have a daughter, Christine, who is married and lives in Switzerland.

Mr. Tangemann's active business life leaves him little leisure time, which he likes to spend in his garden or occasionally playing a round of golf with his wife. His other interests include reading and photography, but he regrets that he does not have more time for this.

Best wishes for a very successful term of office.

Mr. Bernhard Simon a well known and well liked person in the Swiss Community for many years, has retired as President of the Federation of Swiss Societies in the U.K. (FOSSUK).

After 10 years in office Mr. B. Simon feels that it is high time for him to step aside. 

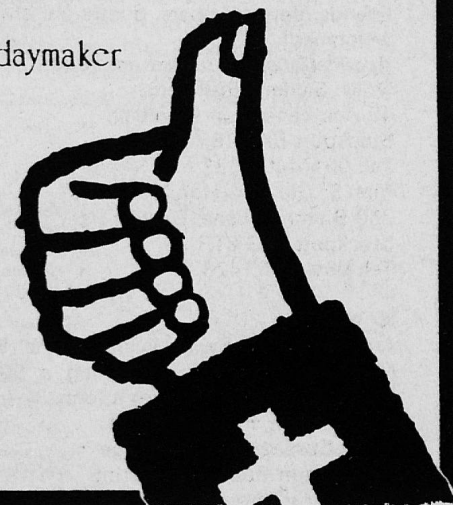

40 Years on...

Little did I realize what fate had in store for me, as I got off the Post Auto at Wolfertswil on that snowy November afternoon in 1943. I was to start work as a "Weberin" in the little factory, owned by Mr. Pfaendler. Mr. Befä, my future boss met me, and helped me find accommodation with two elderly maiden ladies. Next he persuaded "Ma" Stadler, the landlady of the Loewen next door to my lodgings, to allow me to share lunch with another young lady from the factory.

I had no idea that there were British Evadee Soldiers stationed in Switzerland and particularly in these little Toggenburg Villages, as far as Degersheim.

Of course it had to happen: Us two girls had our lunch in the "Nebenstube", and in the "Gaststube" some 30 soldiers were having theirs. In the evening, Ma Stadler invited me over, and so I met my Scots Guardsman. On my birthday, we got engaged and decided to get married.

"That was easier said than done."

Practically every day my fiancée walked to Degersheim, where the officers were stationed, and was told over and over again that it was impossible to get married to a foreigner in wartime and in a "Host Country". That made him all the more determined to succeed. We enlisted Major Gurney's help and the Rev. Ernest Peyer from St. Gallen, who was Chaplain to the Evadees in the area.

After a long and patient wait, we were given a date when we could marry, the 8th of April 1944. When we had to call the bans, Frank had no birth-certificate, therefore "No Wedding."

In desperation, my fiancée wrote to Lieutenant Boyle, who was in his Regiment, and also Mrs. Norton, whose husband was the British Minister in Berne. Thanks to their help we finally got permission to get married on the 4th of July 1944.

From there we were transferred to Arosa, where we spent a lovely three months in "Haus Wolfensberg". Most of the British soldiers were allowed to return home in October.

I was now expecting a baby and wanted to be in England to be with my husband. I started writing to the British Consul in Zurich, and my husband wrote to the British Home Office. After many false starts, we finally had a definite date: the 24th April 1945.



It was still wartime of course, and we could only travel at night. We arrived in Newhaven in the late afternoon of the 26th April. My companions on that momentous journey were:

Mrs. Smith from Buelach,
Mrs. C. Meredith from Flawil,
Mrs. A. L. Dick-Mueller from Luzern,
Mrs. Ida Goddard-Huber from Degersheim,

Mrs. Gertrud Kitchen-Gerbert from Degersheim,

Mrs. Hulda Smith-Buehler also from Degersheim area.

We would love to hear from any of these ladies, who are hopefully still in this country, to reminisce and maybe meet.

In our own area, we have a thriving Swiss Club, and although we have a very large catchment area, I have never heard of anyone from these first arrivals in this country. We have three children all of which are married, one lives in Switzerland, one in New Zealand and the youngest lives in England.
