Without your help I just would not have been able to reach the target I had set myself, that is to say: to continuously mark the presence of our country in Australia, to strengthen the economic and cultural relations between the two countries and to further the feeling of togetherness within the Swiss community. I have no doubt whatsoever that Consul General Richard Wolf who will succeed me end of April will strive to continue on the same lines.

Looking back on the ten years I have been serving my country in Australia I readily admit that I and my wife had a good time here. The vastness of the country, its history, its nature as well as its people have always exerted a great attraction on us. We have seen a great deal of the country and will be seeing more on the journey by car around Australia on which we'll set out immediately following my retirement. My wife and I will have look at all those spots worthwhile seeing on which for some reason or another we missed out so far. We will take our time - two to three months - and later prepare to return for good to Switzerland, sometimes in May.

We are leaving Australia with feelings of indebtedness to all — men and women alike — who have spared neither time nor trouble to show the Swiss flag and thus contribute to the credit our country has been enjoying "down under".

SWISS-AUSTRALIAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY

As a result of an extensive investigation by a special Steering Committee established early last year, a number of Business people decided to establish a Swiss-Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The response from Swiss and Australian Companies has been very encouraging and Registration formalities are proceeding. The main objective of the Chamber will be the promotion of Business and Trade between Switzerland and Australia. More specifically, the broad spectrum of tasks will be

- to safeguard Swiss Business interests on the Australian market
- to promote business relations
- to assist small and medium-sized Swiss firms who try to enter the Australian market by giving them information and advice on that market
- vice versa to give the same assistance to Australian firms trying to gain a foothold on the Swiss market.

A close association in relation to these aims will be maintained with the Swiss Embassy in Canberra and the Consulates General in Melbourne and Sydney.


