Mosaic

In 1985 more marriages were contracted in Switzerland than in 1984. The birthrate, however, continues to decline and is clearly below the level that would be necessary to maintain, in the long term, the balance of the Swiss population.

The figures for emigration from Switzerland have remained 9,872 practically constant: Swiss, liable for military service, left our country in 1985. Favourite countries were the USA, Federal Germany and France.



Just 175 years after the first ascent of the Jungfrau: from next year, the newly-built restaurant at the Jungfraujoch will offer visitors an incomparable panoramic view.

Over the next five years, SFr. 20 million is to be spent on demonstration and pilot plants for the rational, economical and non-polluting use of energy. The Federal Council has asked Parliament to grant a corresponding framework credit.

Telegrams

- From 31st May, 1987, Geneva-Cointrin Airport, like Zurich-Kloten, will have an airport railway station.
- Marianne von Grünigen is our second lady ambassador. She will be Head of Mission in Helsinki.





- The International Hot-Air Balloon Weeks will be held in Château d'Oex at the end of January, 1987.
- In the last five years the area of arable land in Switzerland shrank by 4%. During the same period the number of farmers went down by 13%.
- On 1st August, 1986 the national Gotthard Museum on the Gotthard Pass opened its doors to the public.
- Publicity for Industry Location Switzerland. BIGA, the Federal Office for Industry and Labour, has revised and republished the brochure «Industriestandort Schweiz».
- The new Soil Conservation Law came into force on 1st September, 1986. It aims at the long-term preservation of soil fertility.
- National Councillor Valentin Oehen, who recently withdrew from the National Action, has founded a new party: the Ökologisch-Freiheitliche Partei (Ecological-Liberal Party).
- The People's Initiative «for a Switzerland without army and with a comprehensive peace policy» has been handed in to the Federal Chancellery.
- Federal Councillors Alphons Egli and Kurt Furgler have announced their retirement at the end of 1986.
- A Nationalfonds (science research promotion fund) study concludes that, with technical improvements in Switzerland, about a third of electricity consumption can be saved.
