Alpaufzug Inauguration 28th April 1987

At 12.00 on Tuesday, 28th April 1987, the final addition to the Swiss Centre Glockenspiel was inaugurated, and this completed the gift from the people of Switzerland and Liechtenstein to the City of Westminster which has become one of London's great attractions.

The Lord Mayor of Westminster, Councillor Mrs. Terence Mallinson J.P. set in motion a beautiful "Alpaufzug", a procession of 23 wood-carved herdsmen and animals depicting the traditional event when the farmers of Switzerland lead the cows and goats to the alpine meadows for the summer grazing. (These figures have been carved in Brienz and are almost half life-size).

Roche wins Queen's Award for Export Achievement 1987

Roche Products Limited is honoured to receive the Queen's Award for Export Achievement 1987.

The citation reads:

"This is the UK subsidiary of the international vitamins, fine chemicals and pharmaceuticals group. As a UK market leader, it has invested heavily in high quality production, backed by competitive and resourceful marketing and by employee commitment. More than half of its output is exported, mainly within Europe and to North America, but with important entry in other markets including Japan."

Roche exports a wide range of pharmaceutical products from Welwyn Garden City, and vitamins and fine chemicals from its Scottish plant in Ayrshire. The exports in 1986 had a value of £72 million and accounted for more than 50 per cent of the company's turnover.

The growth rate of the export business is very high with an increase of 150 per cent in the last two years. Currently exports go to more than 30 countries on five continents.

The largest single investment ever within the Roche group was made in the UK in 1983 with the building of a new vitamin C plant in Scotland at a cost of £150 million. In the pharmaceutical research division 300 scientists are engaged in the search for new medicines for the treatment of arthritis, cardiovascular diseases, and viral conditions, including AIDS.



OBITUARY

We announce with deep regret that Mr Paul Bessire, of 28 Cumberland Road. London, SW13, died on 27th February, shortly before his 90th birthday.

Paul Bessire came to Britain from Bienne as an 18-year old language student, fully intending to go back to his native Bienne to which he kept a life-long loyalty. His father was a Director of the Omega watch company and played an active part in Bienne's public life. After having built up his own business in the 'twenties (mica trade and importing telegraph poles from Sweden,) Paul lost everything during the war. With indomitable courage, he built up a business of industrial tools and components and was responsible for a first press for razor blades.

In April 1930, at the Swiss Church in Antoinette married he London, Schuepbach of the Neudhâtel Branch of the old Emmental family, daughter of the then General Manager of the Crédit Lyonnais in London. All these years, they lived in their house in Barnes where they brought up two daughters, both now married and with two children each. He was a very keen gardener and proud of the results of his labours.

In his quiet and unassuming way, Paul Bessire has always been very active in the Swiss community, member of the City Swiss Club, the Swiss Mercantile Society, the Swiss Economic Council, the Swiss Rifle Association and above all the New Helvetic Society, of which he was a Member. He generously Honorary supported many ventures in the community.

Until he was 70, he was a member of the Consistoire of the Swiss Church. For many years, the "Réunions de Paroisse" were held at his home, and he even worked as a Sunday School teacher.

Mrs Bessire always supported her husband in all his activities, and did active work, both in the local WRVS and the Swiss community.

Paul Bessire carried discomfort and pain with great courage and fortitude. The same applies now to his wife in her sad bereavement, and she and her family are grateful for Paul's long and rich life.

We extend our deep sympathy to Antoinette and her devoted family, and perhaps they will find solace in the knowledge that we shall treasure his

The second death we have to report with great regret is that of the concert pianist Albert Ferber who died on 12th January at the age of nearly 76. Albert Ferber was born in Lucerne and studied in Switzerland, Germany, France and England. He was in this country during the war, and he gave recitals at Wigmore Hall at a very early age.

He never looked back and travelled widely, always with notable success. He played with many great orchestras and under several famous conductors.

Spanish and South American composers were amongst his favourites, and he toured South America many times, but who could forget his rendering of Schubert's Wanderer Phantasy with difficult cadenza only played by great artists. I remember with vivid delight his sensitive playing of Schubert's Impromptu, op. number 2. Some members of the City Swiss Club may recall it when he played it at one of the recitals organised by the Club after informal dinners after the war.

He was a great master of Debussy's piano works, and he, together with Walter Gieseking, was the only foreign pianist accepted by the critical French as true exponents of the great French composer. In some ways, Albert Ferber was a loner, but a most kind and generous man and patient teacher. His positive attitude to life helped him to overcome much illness. Many have lost a good and loyal friend whom we shall remember as an outstanding pianist, but also as a man of many enviable qualities. M.M.

Sherlock Holmes Returns to Switzerland "Centenary, My Dear Watson"

It is one hundred years since the world first met Sherlock Holmes and Dr. John H. Watson.

To mark this most auspicious centenary, seventy members of the Sherlock Holmes Society of London will visit Switzerland which is celebrating 200 years of tourism. Switzerland was, of course, the scene of the fateful meeting between Sherlock Holmes, the world's famous detective, and Professor Moriarty, his arch enemy and Napoleon of crime, which seemingly culminated in both plunging to their deaths at the fearsome Reichenbach

Assembling from all over the world, the entourage will travel in Victorian costume, visiting more than twenty places in ten days as they follow the meandering route taken by Holmes and his faithful companion, Watson. Places to be visited include Geneva, Lausanne, Vevey, Montreux, Vex, Leukerbad, Brig, Kandersteg, Interlaken and Meiringen. During this remarkable perambulation, organised by the S.N.T.O. Office, singular events will occur and be witnessed.

Events perceived to happen are as diverse as a Victorian bathing party followed by breakfast on floating trays, the Battle of the Cows, meeting the President of the Swiss National Council, a reception at the Chateau de Lucens (home of the Sir Arthur Conan Doyle Foundation, Conan Doyle Museum and reconstruction of Holmes' consulting room at 221B Baker Street), and a banquet at the Castle of Oron.

The climax of the trip will be the laying of the foundation stone of the new Sherlock Holmes Museum at Meiringen by Air Commandant Dame Jean Conan Doyle, daughter of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.
