On the occasion of the Swiss Days at EXPO 88 in Brisbane, Federal Councillor Jean-Pascal Delamuraz, Minister for Economic Affairs and Vice-President of the Federal Council, Berne, will pay an official visit to Australia. After talks with government representatives in Canberra, Mr Delamuraz will visit Sydney and arrive in Brisbane on July 31, 1988.

## EXPO 88

Federal Councillor Jean-Pascal Delamuraz, Minister for Economic Affairs and Vice-President of the Federal Council, Berne, will be the special guest of all Swiss-Australians at the Swiss Days Celebrations at EXPO 88 in Brisbane this year.

Planning is in the advanced stages for a spectacular celebration of the 697th Anniversary of the proclamation of Swiss nationhood. On two days, Sunday, July 31 and of course Monday, August 1, Switzerland will be the focus of the entire \$A600 million World Exposition.

The Swiss Days Celebrations are being organised by Madeleine Beck of Beck Enterprises in Brisbane, in conjunction with the Farner PR Organisation in Zurich.

In all, more than 200 entertainers from Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne are expected to be on hand to show Australians a real taste of Swiss-styled celebrations.

Yodelling, alphorn playing, coin whirling and folkloric groups will entertain the crowds, while there will also be a lantern parade on the evening of August 1.

Amongst the entertainers will be xylophone virtuoso Ralph Heid, mime René Quellet and singer and pianist Daniela Simmons.

Sunday, July 31 will see a reuniting of Swiss from all over Australia, while on Monday, August 1, there will be an Official Luncheon in the Pavilion of Switzerland with Mr Delamuraz as special guest.

The Pavilion of Switzerland has proven itself to be one of the most popular exhibits at World EXPO 88, with its theme "A day in Switzerland" really catching the imagination of EXPO crowds with its artificial ski slope, aerial cableway, authentic Swiss Restaurant and Swiss Information Centre.

Other Swiss exhibits of interest on the EXPO site include the Heureka, built by Tingueli for Swiss EXPO 64 in Lausanne, while the Swiss mime group, Mummenschanz, is also booked for an appearance during the six-month event.

## Important Message to all Swiss Living in Australia

### The Place of the Swiss Abroad — Australian Progress Report

**The place of the Swiss Abroad is a gift from us all to our beloved fatherland, the "Rütli" of all those Swiss living abroad who continuously spread the Swiss message of democracy, peace, excellence, integrity, national and industrial unity, the peaceful coexistence of nations, freedom, and the type of environment which the Swiss endeavour to continuously fight to preserve within the framework of a very human society.**

You have, no doubt, read about the exciting project of a special place for the Swiss Abroad in Brunnen, which is to be acquired for the occasion of the 700th Anniversary of Switzerland in 1991. The Swiss Abroad themselves have initiated this idea in 1986 in Morges during the annual Day of the Swiss Abroad, and during which the undersigned was present. It has been said again and again that the Swiss Abroad, some 460,000 in numbers all over the world, are making a substantial contribution towards the presence of Switzerland as a Nation true to its principles and neutrality.

All the things to be said about this project are contained in articles published in the last *Swiss Review*. Should you be unable to find your copy, we suggest that you contact your Consulate General in Melbourne or Sydney.

There are some 13,000 Swiss living in Australia — the cost of acquiring the land and of developing a concept for its use to be decided by a world-wide competition, is \$6.50 for each Swiss living abroad. This would mean some \$85,000 for Australia, and represents the fund-raising target which I propose we should attempt to reach. The following are a few suggestions:

1. Direct donations to be sent to the undersigned, will be acknowledged, cheques should be made payable to "Swiss Memorial 1991". The money will be deposited in a special bank account at the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, Pendle Hill, NSW 2145, account no. 31975.





2. The traditional National Day badge could be sold for \$5 instead of the mandatory \$2, and the additional money could be made available for the appeal. IT SHOULD BE MADE CLEAR THAT THIS MUST BE ADVERTISED AS SUCH, I.E., WHERE THE ADDITIONAL MONEY GOES.
3. Letter writing campaign to Industry and Friends of Switzerland.
4. We are trying to organise an "Unterhaltungsabend" (evening celebration) during the Swiss days at EXPO 88 in Brisbane.
5. You could run a special guessing competition or other such event.
6. Special function — in fact, we suggest that each Swiss organisation should plan for such an event in 1988, or join forces in the larger cities, such as Sydney and Melbourne.

The Swiss Club of New South Wales for instance has decided to donate the proceeds of the annual "Metzgete" in May to the appeal.
