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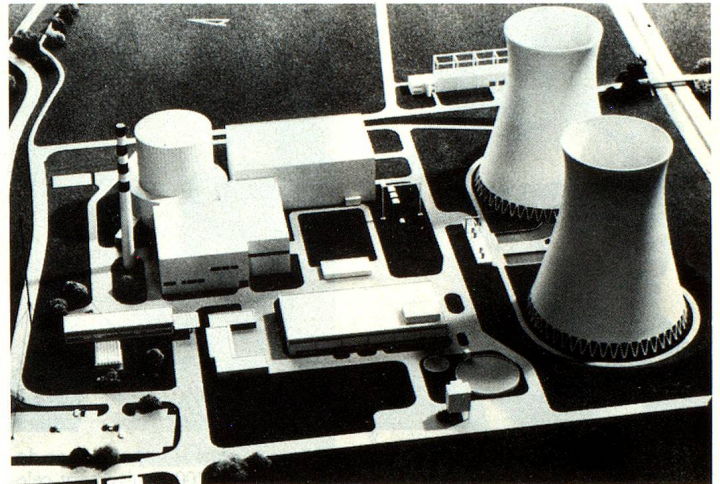

▲ Red carpet visitors in Switzerland: The portuguese Prime Minister Mario Soares (with Federal President Otto Stich, left)...

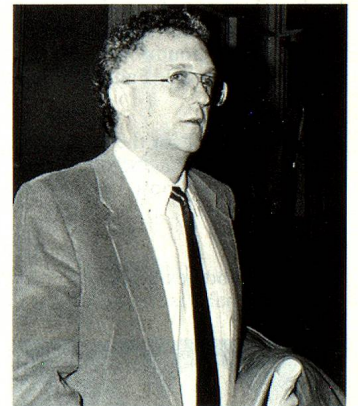

▼ Asylum seeking refugees are being accommodated in remotely located so-called «Federal centres» as a result of the dramatic increase in their number.



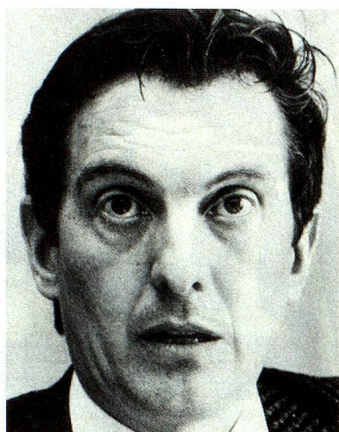

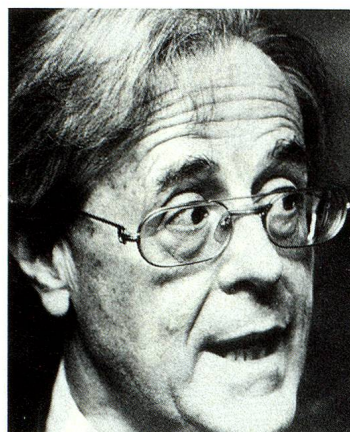
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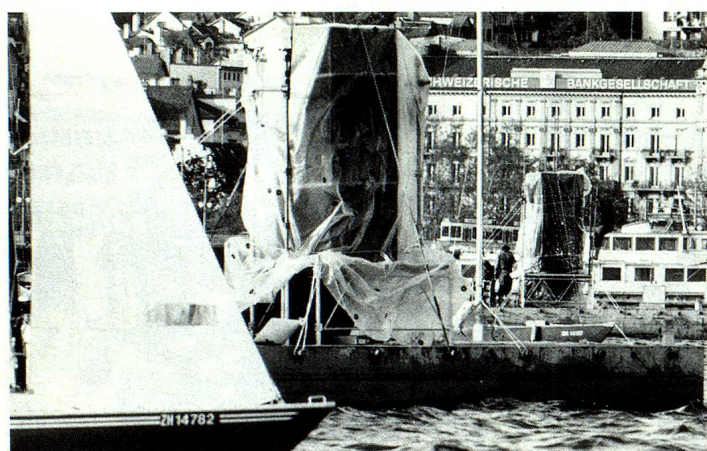
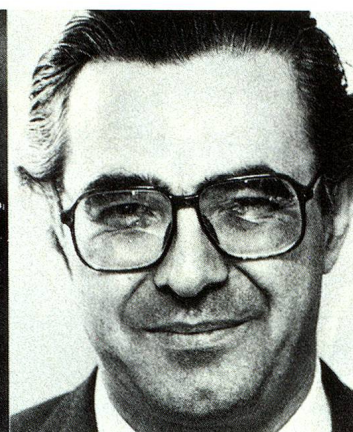

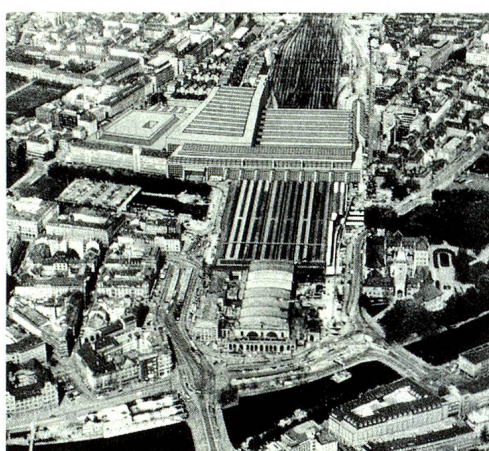

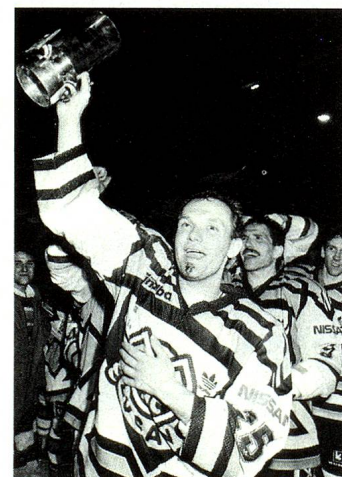
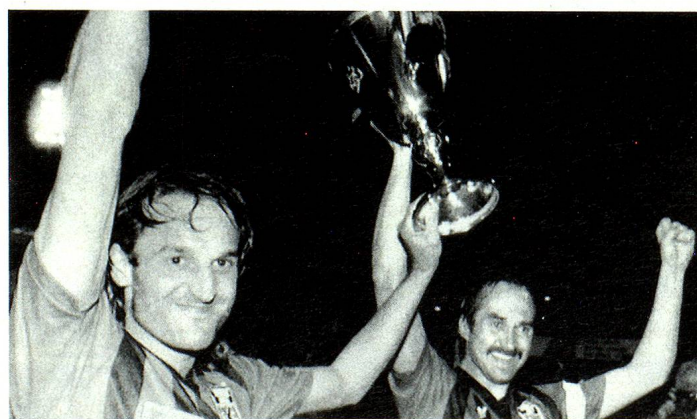

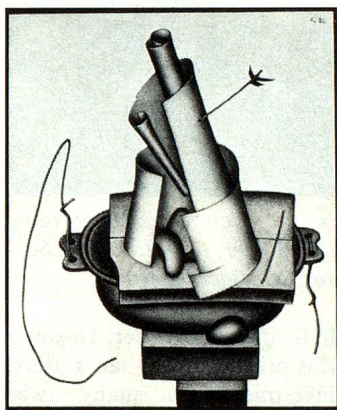

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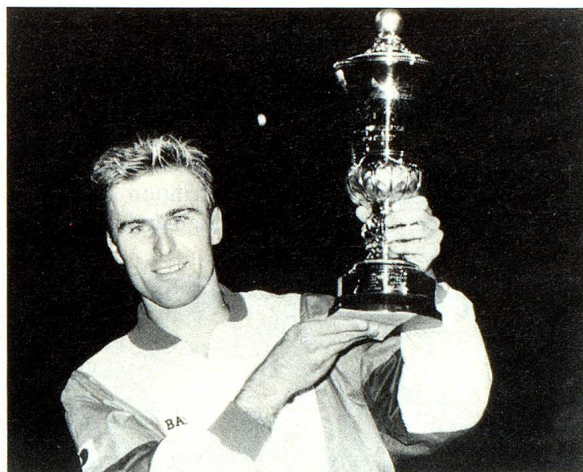
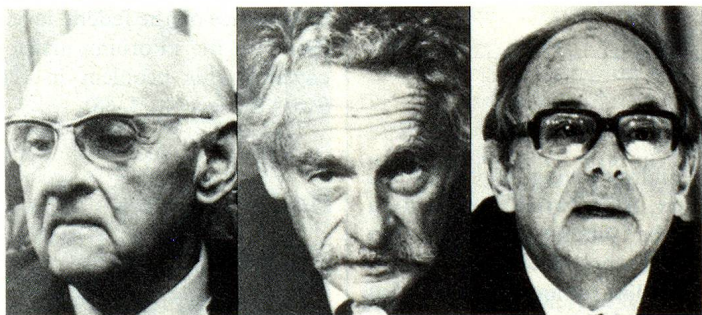

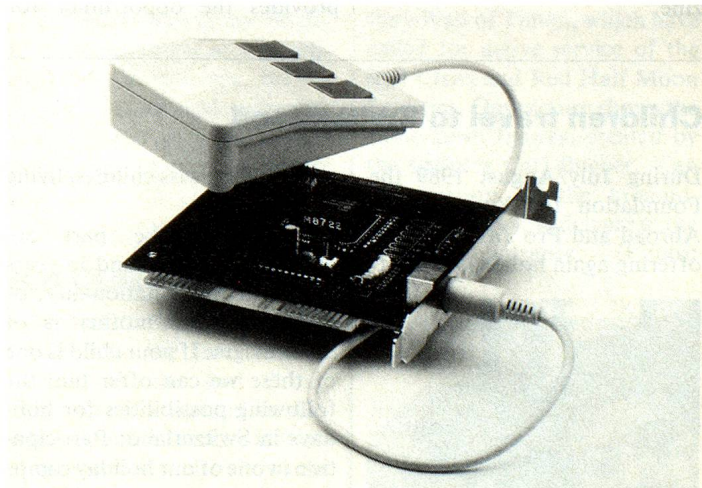
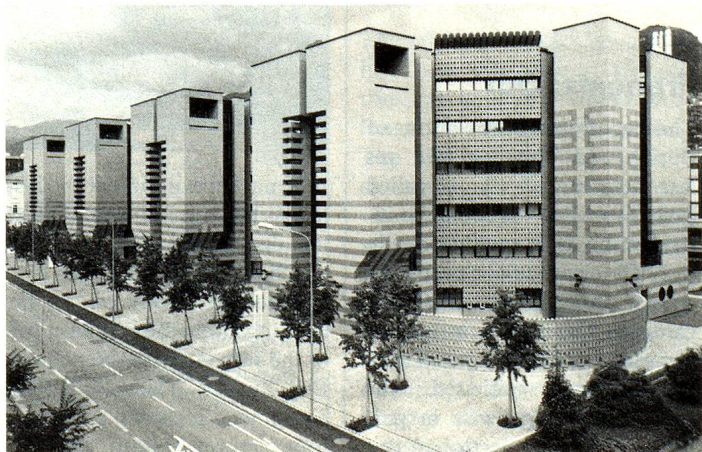
