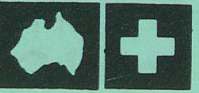

The next issue, Nr. 4/91, will appear at the end of September and should reach the readers in Australia in October 1991.

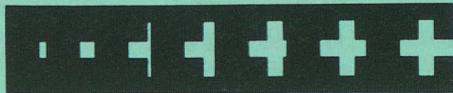

The highlight of our entry was the Float, which featured a scaled down version of a typical Swiss Chalet. This was designed by Fred Blöchliger and built by his father, Louis Blöchliger, together with Jacob Jucker, Ferdi Wydler and other helpers. It was an absolute masterpiece.

The Exhibition "Swiss Artists in Australia" was opened on the 28th March by his Excellency Dr. John Davis McCaughey AC, the Governor of Victoria, in the presence of his Excellency, The Ambassador of Switzerland, Dr. Arnold Hugentobler, the Consul General of Switzerland in Melbourne, Mr Leo Renggli, the Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Councillor Richard Wynne, and many guests. The Address given by our Ambassador was outstanding and I, for one, felt very proud to be a Swiss in Melbourne. According to Westpac Gallery a total of 26,590 people visited the Exhibition.

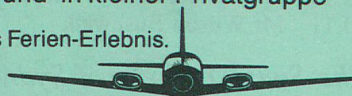

William Tell is coming to town

The 700th anniversary of Switzerland stirs up some rare emotions in most Swiss no matter how remote a place they live in, even in Western Australia. It is in this spirit that the Swiss Club of Western Australia set out to make a very special contribution to the celebrations with a Swiss play.

Without much talent from our own ranks, and without financial backing from any corporate heavyweights, this proved to be a rather difficult task at first. However, thanks to professional advice from the Department for the Arts, a great deal of understanding, enthusiasm and co-operation from Curtin University, and subsequently the financial commitment from our Consul General, we were able to engage the Hayman Theatre Company to mount a play based on the turbulent times of around 1291.

The play is called, what else, "William Tell". But, although heavily modelled on Schiller's Wilhelm Tell, the play is a considerably modernised version of the latter.

In writing the piece the playwright had two things in mind. Firstly, he wanted the play to be fast-moving and exciting so that it would appeal not only to adults but also to children of most age groups. Secondly, he wanted to illustrate the important historical events and give some idea about how and why Switzerland was founded.
