Editorial

Dear Fellow-Citizens all over the world,



This year the Swiss Confederation is looking back over the 700 years of its existence. Switzerland is also able to celebrate this anniversary because our fellow-citizens – men and women alike – living abroad have made a major contribution towards shaping the Switzerland of today.

At the time of its foundation, the Confederation was mainly concerned with its own pressing problems. Let us, my compatriots living in other countries, rejoice in the diversity of characteristics which history has brought forth in our valleys and regions in the course of these 700 years and which will be highlighted during the events and festivities which will be held throughout the country. But throughout all these festivals and rejoicings let us not forget that we are not only Swiss but at the same time Europeans and citizens of this world.
