## Swiss Abroad Reception for Federal Council

*On 1 August 1991 all seven members of the Federal Council visited the Place of the Swiss Abroad. Hundreds of Swiss Abroad received the Federal Council in the tent designed by Ticino architect Mario Botta. Congratulatory messages from all over the world underlined the presence of the «Fifth Switzerland» in every continent.*

The Botta-designed tent gave a special aspect to the Place of the Swiss Abroad, which is intended to symbolise the solidarity of the Swiss Abroad with their homeland this year and in the years to come. The Swiss Abroad warmly applauded the distinguished guests, the Federal Council, the Speakers of European Parliaments and the members of the Council for the Swiss Abroad. In his address Professor Walther Hofer, President of the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad, stressed that Switzerland and Europe depended on each other. In view of the historic decisions they would be called upon to make, Professor Hofer urged the Swiss Abroad to make active use of the newly-acquired right to

vote by post and to set a good example to their fellow-citizens in Switzerland as regards voting figures.

As representative of the federal

government, Federal Councillor René Felber gave a further indication of Switzerland's positive attitude in its approach to Europe. In their messages of congratulation, five Swiss living abroad, representing all five continents, emphasised their belief in an open-minded attitude to Europe and the world. They all expressed their faith in Switzerland, whose fortunes they followed with great interest, even though living abroad.

Here are two quotations from the congratulatory messages:

*«Home for us is Switzerland... But home for us is also where we live, where our children grow up...» (Elisabeth Michel)*

*«... I congratulate Switzerland on this very special day. May Switzerland remain forever prosperous, may its mountains never crumble and may it keep producing chocolate...» (Indira Varma)*



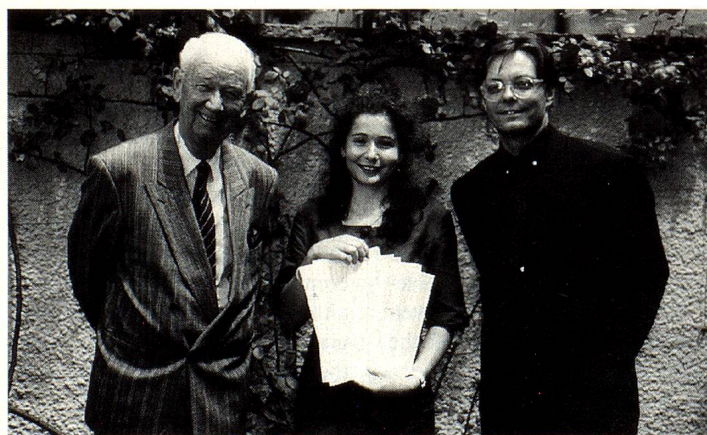
