The Council for the Swiss Abroad as a link with politicians

Advocates for the Fifth Switzerland in parliament

The Organisation for the Swiss Abroad does not itself nominate candidates for the Federal Assembly. But parliamentarians sit on its committees, and these act as a link to politicians and look after the interests of the Fifth Switzerland in parliament.

Both houses of parliament are in session. In the corridors politicians meet not only each other but also journalists and representatives of the most varied institutions who want to make their opinions known just before a debate. If, for example, a decision on the future of the optional state pension scheme or the federal subsidy for Swiss Review is to be decided upon, the Organisation for the Swiss Abroad (OSA) will also be there trying to put forward its views.

in the cause they are representing so that they can marshal convincing arguments in regular contacts with politicians willing to listen.

An ideal body for such contacts is the Council for the Swiss Abroad (CSA) which is made up of about 100 delegates from all over the world as well as 40 home members from the political, cultural and economic spectrums. At present all four coalition parties and the Liberal Party are represented in the CSA.

Permanent contacts

But it would be an illusion to suppose that parliamentary decisions can actually be influenced at the last minute – or for that matter at all. It is permanent lobbying with a long-term aim in view which is indispensable for an interest group like the OSA. Those involved must believe

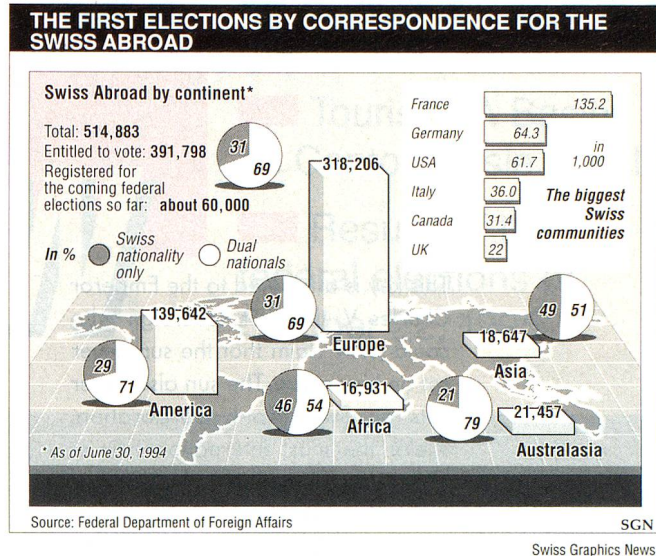
them is a candidate. (For how to vote, see page 8.)

The candidates on the list include those already in parliament from the Liberal Democratic, Social Democratic and Liberal parties. There are no present members representing the Christian Democrats or the Swiss People's Party. This is because either the member is not standing again (Eva Segmüller, CVP) or has recently retired from the National Council and has not yet been replaced in the CSA (Gianfranco Cotti, CVP; Elisabeth Zölch, SVP). Pierre Duvoisin, SP, is also not standing again.

The list also includes new candidates, two of whom live abroad and if elected will be members of the National Council as Swiss Abroad. Another Swiss Abroad is also standing for the National Council, but she does not belong to the CSA and is therefore not on the list (see also page 6/7).
