#### 1997 Congress of the Swiss Abroad

## **Creative art abroad**

Swiss creative artists will be at the centre of this year's Congress of the Swiss Abroad. They will be showing their work and talking about it in Lugano on August 22–24.

Switzerland's cultural presence abroad is the main subject of the 1997 Congress of the Swiss Abroad (see Swiss Review 1/97). The meeting will include a colourful range of discussions and presentations. It will concentrate not on academic lectures but on

the practical side of Swiss creative art abroad, including both its positive and negative aspects.

Art is not so much those who create it as their works. In consequence, the Congress will also show a broad selection of artistic objects.

## 1998: Visit Switzerland in the anniversary year

In 1998 Switzerland will celebrate the 150th anniversary year of the creation of the federal state. The Congress of the Swiss Abroad will be an integral part of the celebrations and should enable as many as possible of our compatriots abroad to visit Switzerland. Its main subject will be "Migration and Encounters", and it will be held on August 20-23 in Canton Aargau. Pencil this date in your diary now. There will be opportunities for combining participation in the Congress and staying with a Swiss family (see page 11).

### Spring meeting of the Council for the Swiss Abroad (CSA) in Bern Yes to AHV reform, but not in this way!

The voluntary pension scheme (AHV/IV) for Swiss Abroad is in deficit and administratively costly in its present form. The Council for the Swiss Abroad has therefore never questioned a certain need for reform, but the alternative scheme now prepared by the authorities would drastically restrict the circle of those entitled to join. Those particularly affected would be Swiss women married to foreigners and compatriots who have long lived in countries with relatively undeveloped social security schemes.

The Council is convinced that a reform is possible which will reduce the deficit of the voluntary pension scheme and will not greatly restrict the circle of those entitled to join. In a resolution it therefore demands that more consideration be given to the legitimate interests of Swiss Abroad.

To the Council's satisfaction it has further been informed about the successful youth exchange project of



the Secretariat for the Swiss Abroad. Michael Reinhard (19) from Reconviller BE spoke at the meeting about his stay with a Swiss family in South Africa. He is already looking forward to accommodating his "brother" there next winter. With the Swiss Club Alba-

with the Swiss Club Albania, the Asociatia Elvatiana Din Romania (Swiss Club in Rumania) and the Société Suisse du Haut-Doubs (France), the Council has on the other hand been able to admit new groups abroad. RL
