Education and training of young Swiss Abroad

Must save; will save

Education and training are amongst the most important things Swiss Abroad want from Switzerland. With its Law on the Training of Swiss Abroad (AAG), the federal government has taken legislative account of this.

The AAG is the legal basis for providing advice to young Swiss Abroad wishing to complete their education or training in Switzerland. This is mainly the task of AJAS, the Association for the Training of Young Swiss Abroad. The AAG also contains provisions for the education of Swiss citizens in other countries, mainly at the 17 recognised Swiss schools in various parts of the world.

This item has not been spared from the general pressure for budget cuts. Although the Federal Council has rejected the proposal to cancel the subsidies altogether which was under consideration in the Department of Home Affairs – which is responsible – it has nevertheless mandated it to consider how they may be reduced, especially for schools in Europe.

The schools themselves have not been slow to react, and they have already undertaken savings measures. In addition, a series of 'summit' conferences was held last spring at which the heads of schools in Europe

and Latin America discussed in detail closer cooperation and further savings potential.

But it is clear that these institutions could not survive as Swiss schools without some support from Berne, and if they were abolished or ceased to be Swiss this would have serious consequences not only for the Swiss communities in the countries concerned but also for the presence of Switzerland in general terms. Particularly in today's circumstances, the effect of these schools in promoting Switzerland's image – which is mentioned in the article of the AAG explaining its purpose – is something in which the Swiss government has the greatest possible interest.
