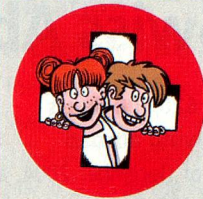
## Thomas Straubhaar: Swiss Expatriate Prize 2005

ASO. Thomas Straubhaar, Professor of Business in Hamburg, has been awarded the Swiss Expatriate Prize for 2005 by the FDP Switzerland International. The award ceremony was held in Basel on 17 March, attended by Pascal Couchepin, member of the Swiss Federal Council.

Straubhaar was born in 1957 and has been President of the Hamburg Institute of International Economics (HWWA) since 1999. He has previously lectured at home and abroad. He has championed liberal economic structures in Germany and, thanks to his knowledge of the Swiss economy, also acts as a valuable ambassador for Switzerland abroad.

Thomas Straubhaar has done excellent work for the Swiss community abroad; outlining the reasons for their choice, the FDP Switzerland International said that his work has a radiating effect at home and abroad. ASO
