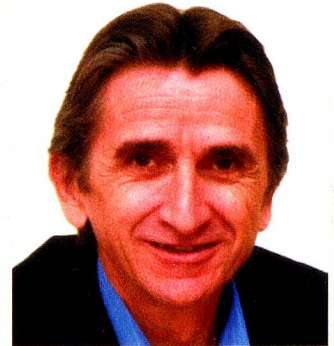

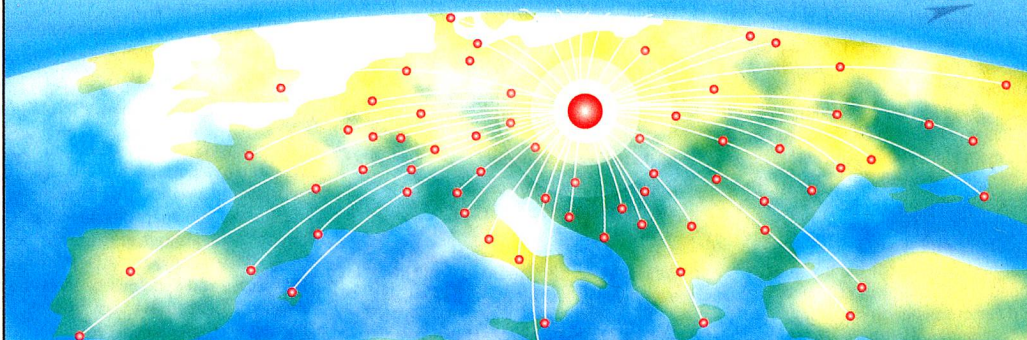

Embassy Changes (continued)

While in Canberra, Mr Henchoz witnessed many interesting developments and events in Australia and its neighbouring countries. He also participated in the preparation for the visits of two Federal Councillors and of a delegation of Swissmedic, which contributed to the strengthening of bilateral relations between Switzerland and Australia. Finally, among others, he devoted much attention to Swiss interests in the field of economics.

The latter are particularly important. Not only because Switzerland is one of the main foreign direct investors in Australia, but also because numerous Swiss companies, whatever their size may be, are active in this country. It is important that they evolve within a framework of supporting their activities and development.

Alain-Denis will be remembered for his efforts to represent Switzerland, its languages, its cultures, and its customs, in Canberra schools. His efforts to stage presentations on Switzerland in French, stimulated the French-speaking part of the Swiss community in Canberra and Sydney.

CSA, AHV Rent recipients and UPP

Contrary to some other European countries, no special arrangements are in place for those who wish to apply for an income tax deduction, since they have at the time made their AHV contributions after paying income tax. Such a deduction may be possible, but must be applied for individually from the Australian Taxation Office by submitting a request for a private ruling. The corresponding guidelines are in a publication of the Australian Taxation Department, "Undeducted purchase price of pensions and annuities (Section Foreign pensions or annuities)". It can be obtained from the Australian Government website. This will then allow one to download the form, "Request for a determination of the deductible amount of UPP of a foreign pension or annuity". You may also request the information by phoning the ATO. Figures of your annual contributions may be obtained from the AHV authorities in Geneva. Please note that only your own personal contributions should be used and not the employer contributions.

Dear Readers,

I would like to reflect on the Swiss Festival which took place on 6th April 2008 at the Austrian Club, Heidelberg West, Victoria.

The idea for the Swiss Festival was born a few years ago and was previously organised by the Swiss Club of Victoria as a fund raiser for Swiss groups. At the meeting of the Committee of Joint Swiss Ventures (CJSV) it was decided to use this tried and tested model as the major event of the year to present a united multicultural Switzerland to Victorians. At the same time it was to give Swiss community groups a sense of belonging after the closure of the Melbourne consulate. In the process these groups met once a month to forge closer ties and to assist each other with promoting functions etc.

Back in November 2007 a newly set up Swiss Festival committee promptly took charge of the organisation. Finances and sponsorship had to be secured and a fair amount of time was spent on advertising and promoting the event. The Swiss Festival appeared on many websites and leaflets were dropped off at the Melbourne Visitor Centre (Federation Square.) In the end the combined effort of the committee paid off and sponsorship in form of money and raffle prizes was obtained. Putting the program together was no small task either considering the choice of talents the Swiss community has to offer. Again we managed to present a variety of interesting performers and also added children entertainment (Jumping Castle and roving magician.)

The Austrian Club in Heidelberg West was again our venue of choice. The excellent cooperation between the two clubs facilitates the occasion. And the beautiful garden with the children's playground, the stalls and ample parking creates the desired effect for what we wanted to achieve.

When the big day finally arrived, the huge turnout caught us by surprise. It was an uplifting moment to see so many young people, families with children and so many new faces. The overwhelming support of our members and friends of the Swiss Club was a humble but fulfilling experience for me. Being an outdoor event we enjoyed a glorious day which was essential to the success. It was estimated that the number of attendees was close to 1'000. Over 750 sausages, 60kgs of potato salad, three wheels of cheese and more than 500 cups of coffees were consumed and the kitchen ran out of plates halfway through the day! The program was packed with highlights and the visitors seemed to thoroughly enjoy the dances, music, Yodel, Alphorn Blowing competition and various other presentations. The Swiss community groups had their own stands with information on their organisation and membership. Some of

them sold traditional foodstuff, souvenirs and pre-loved items.

However our stated goal was to involve all Victoria based Swiss community groups in the Swiss Festival. Looking back the entire committee is 100% pleased and satisfied with the commitment that each one of them put forward. We are one Swiss as Erika Kimpton, Honorary Consul of Switzerland (Victoria) coined the event. Going forward, I am happy to advise that we have a mandate to organise the next Swiss Festival. I hope we will see you all in 2009!

The Swiss Festival committee thanks its hosts the Austrian Club and acknowledges the generous support of its sponsors, entertainers, Swiss community groups, friends and volunteers and looks forward to a continuous partnership.

The award winning trio lived up to their reputation and the audience were rewarded with their spell binding music which was followed by a magnificent buffet."

In Sydney on Friday, 13 June, Dr. Helmet Jerjen of the Mt Stromlo Observatory, Australian National University Canberra, was guest speaker for the SACA Annual General Meeting.
