by Lina Wisler-Beck, 22 June 1920

Niene isch Chilbi u niene isch Tanz deheime ums Hus um versuret me ganz. I ha mer scho mängisch der Chopf fasch verheit, was ächt no wär z'mache, dass Zyt umegeit.

Wär gwönet isch z'gumpe und z'tanze, o je, däm düe halt die Süche-Verordnige weh. E jede muess säge, churzwiligs isch's nit. No bsunders für ledigi, lustigi Lüt.

Grad äbe der Sunndig wird eim eso läng, s'Furtgoh isch verbote, u nämlech no sträng. Gsiech eim deno öpper, o weisch de häts gfählt, do müesst me schwär buesse – u-ni ha kes Gäld!

Drumm blieb i doheime. I schicke mi dry, u hoffe dä Jammer gang öppe verby. I bi jo nid einzig, s'trifft anderi o, s'isch nume es gwöne. – Mi zahmet de scho!

This dialect poem, which reads as if it were written today, was in fact composed a century ago when the Spanish flu pandemic was raging around the world for over two years. In Switzerland, where it affected more than 50% of the population, 24,449 people died. Together with the coinciding general strike (Landesstreik) in November 1918, it was the gravest demographic catastrophe in modern Swiss history.

Election of delegates to serve on **The Council of the Swiss Abroad (CSA)** for the term 2021–2025

The Council of the Swiss Abroad (CSA) is the representative body in Switzerland for Swiss people living abroad. Australia is entitled to four council seats, New Zealand has two. Elections for the Oceania delegates of the CSA for the term 2021–2025 will take place in June this year.

Election of delegates in New Zealand

The two delegates on the Council of the Swiss Abroad representing New Zealand will be chosen from among members of the Swiss Society of New Zealand and the four regional Swiss Clubs – Auckland, Hamilton, Taranaki and Wellington. They will be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Swiss Society of New Zealand, held on 6 June 2021. www.swiss.org.nz



Election of delegates in Australia

How does the election work?

In Australia the election is conducted by the Swiss Alliance Australia (SAA) – see next page for more details – on behalf of the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad (OSA). Any queries/correspondence should be addressed to the person in charge of election coordination: Martin Scarpino, treasurer/secretary of the SAA, on csaelection2021@gmail.com

In 2017, for the first time ever, the election in Australia was conducted electronically, but due to the cancellation of e-voting by the Federal Government in Switzerland, this option will not be available this time. Instead the election will be by postal Ballot. Once the candidates standing for election have been determined, a Ballot paper will be distributed via the printed and electronic version of the 'Swiss Review – Regional News Oceania'. It will also be available for downloading from the SAA website: www.swissallianceaustralia.org

The 'Swiss Review' is distributed to every registered Swiss household in Oceania. The current circulation is 20,800 subscriptions in total – 12,300 online copies and 8,500 printed copies (no separate figures for Australia only are available). This will ensure that as many as possible of the Swiss living in Australia can take part in these elections if they wish to do so.

Step One: Call for Candidates

To stand as a candidate in these election, you should download the **Application for Candidates** from the website of the SAA **www.swissallianceaustralia.org** and return the completed form together with a colour passport-sized portrait image of yourself to Martin Scarpino (SAA) on **csaelection2021@gmail.com**. Due date is **COB Wednesday**, **31 March**. Applications received after the due date can not be accepted.

WHO CAN STAND FOR ELECTION?

To be eligible, a candidate must:

- be a Swiss citizen (or dual-citizen) living in Australia
- · be 18 years and over
- be registered with the Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney
- demonstrate an interest and commitment to the Swiss community in Australia
- have an interest in the Swiss political process, i.e. be enrolled to vote in Switzerland
- in addition to English, be fluent in either German or French (spoken and written)
- wherever possible attend OSA Council meetings in Switzerland (1 day in March/April and 3 days in August) for the term 2021–2025, at own travel/accommodation expense

Step Two: Call to Vote

A call for eligible Swiss Abroad in Australia to elect their representatives on the Council of the Swiss Abroad will appear in edition 3/21 of the 'Swiss Review – Regional News Oceania' which will be published on Friday, 11 June. It will contain a printed Ballot paper as well as a short version of the profile of each candidate that stands for election. The full version of each candidates' profile will be available on the website of the SAA **www.swissallianceaustralia.org** from Tuesday, 20 April. The Ballot will also be available for downloading from the SAA website.

Due date for Ballots to be received by the SAA is **COB Wednesday**, **30 June**. Ballots received after the due date can not be accepted.

WHO CAN VOTE?

To be eligible, you must be:

• a Swiss citizen residing in Australia

- 18 years and over
- registered with the Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney

If you have not yet registered or provided the consulate your personal email address, you must do so by the end of May to be eligible to vote. Contact the consulate on **sydney@eda. admin.ch**

Step Three: Election Results

The Ballots will be verified and counted by the election coordinator with the assistance of the Consulate General of Switzerland. The four candidates who received the most votes will be elected as the Australian CSA delegates. By first week July, the election results will be submitted to the OSA and announced on the SAA website **www.swissallianceaustralia**. **org** and relevant social media channels.

The constituent meeting of the newly elected Council for the term 2021-2025 will take place in August at the Congress of the Swiss Abroad (either in Lugano or virtual) – see https:// bit.ly/3s4rUNM. A congress report and presentation of the elected delegates will appear in edition 5/21 of the 'Swiss Review – Regional News Oceania' which will be published on Friday, 8 October.
