## VII. SUMMARY OF RELIEF DISTRIBUTED BY THE ICRC

Having concluded the first part of this Report and before going to the second part we thought it would be of interest to give a summary of all relief distributed by the ICRC in 1951. Some of the relief actions have already been mentioned in previous chapters (see in particular Chapters IV and V); reference is made to others in respect to conflicts which broke out after the close of general hostilities and to which the second part of this Report refers.

It will be seen that funds earmarked for the civilian population of East Germany and Greater Berlin, within the relief scheme which came to an end in 1951, still reached about 400,000 francs for the past year.

In Greece the ICRC distributed 236,000 francs for the civilian population, political prisoners and exiles, refugee children and war-disabled.

In Italy a sum of 131,000 francs was shared between repatriated prisoners, the victims of the Pô Valley disaster, refugees and tuberculous war victims.

In regard to Korea and Vietnam, relief supplies for a fairly large amount have had to be put aside the ICRC not having been in a position to distribute them to the victims of the conflict.
