# FINANCE

Although, at the beginning of the year, the outlook for the financing of the ordinary account did not appear to be too promising, one may say that at the end of 1983 the Balance Sheet and the Income and Expenditure Account showed a sound situation.

#### **Balance Sheet**

The Balance Sheet total was markedly higher than the previous year's amount; this may be attributed to three causes:

- (a) "Accrued liabilities" showed an increase of more than 8 million francs, due to an increase in commercial commitments in connection with the ICRC's activities, and to the booking of contributions assigned to the financing of activities covered by the 1984 ordinary budget.
- (b) "Specially Financed Operations", covered by extraordinary budgets, rose by about 20 million francs, corresponding to contributions received but to be utilized only in the first quarter of 1984. This increase is in line with the ICRC's policy to ensure provision of sufficient funds for three months' activity and so to protect itself against cash problems.
- (c) Under the heading "Provisions", the Balance Sheet showed a net rise of about half a million francs to cover operational risks, on the one hand, and the constitution of a special fund for future investments in computers and computerized office equipment amounting to 1.6 million francs.

These increases are reflected on the Assets side of the Balance Sheet under "Other investments". Cash and Current Assets did not vary appreciably.

One more point to be noted concerns the heading "Operations with temporary deficit financing"; this deficit was reduced from 6.6 million francs at the end of 1982 to 1.8 million francs at the end of 1983. As in 1982, this amount comprises mainly the ICRC's deficit in financing its operations in Iraq and Iran, amounting to 1.6 million francs, the balance being accounted for by the action in Poland. Nevertheless, financing the Iraq/Iran action remains a source of concern for the ICRC.

#### Income and expenditure account

This account was presented in a new form, bringing together the movements of the Ordinary Account, the Funds for Relief Operations, the Special Accounts, and the expenditure and income not included in the year's budgets.

In 1983, total expenditure amounted to 168.3 million francs, to which should be added 55.5 million francs of gifts in kind and services—here shown for statistical purposes—that is to say, a grand total of 223.8 million francs.

In 1982, the corresponding figures were: expenditure, 167.5 million; plus gifts in kind and services, 59.6 million; grand total, 227.1 million francs.

Ordinary account expenditure amounted to 50.2 million francs, 13 per cent more than the previous year. The increase was the result of the following activities:

- more extensive efforts for the dissemination of knowledge of humanitarian law and for the development of information and communication means and techniques;
- an increase of operations in the field, and, in Geneva, the expansion of support services providing logistical aid for such operations;
- greater efforts in personnel training (in table II under the item "Other activities" included the sum of 1.25 million francs spent on personnel training).

Apart from budgeted expenditure the sum of 5.4 million francs (table II, column 4) was spent on certain items not provided for in the budget, covering essentially the setting up of a handicapped persons fund, of a fund for the purchase of computers and computerized office equipment and the adjustment of provisions for operational risks and current commitments.

The total expenditure incurred for the items in the ordinary account plus the 5.4 million francs referred to in the paragraph above amounted to 55.6 million francs.

The income in the ordinary account was 54.8 million francs, or 11 per cent more than in 1982 (49.2 million), thanks in good part to larger contributions from governments. To this should be added the sum of 5.5 million francs, representing income not included in the budget, such as revenue from investments and unexpected donations and bequests (see table II, column 4). The total income was therefore 60.3 million francs.

The difference between income (60.3 million) and expenditure (55.6 million) was used to set up a reserve fund of 4.7 million francs (of which 1.7 million was set aside for visits to political detainees) in the regular budget for 1984 which is expected to close with a deficit. The balance of 22,204 francs is shown as excess income over expenditure for 1983.

In the case of Specially Financed Operations, a separate budget is established and appeals sent out to specific governments for each particular operation, and the result of the ordinary account is not affected.

Each operation is accounted for separately. The income and expenditure of all the specially financed operations are shown in the special accounts.

Expenditure over *special accounts* totalled 110.9 million francs; if gifts in kind and services are added, the total expenditure was 158.1 million. There were considerable

fluctuations compared with the 1982 figures, the most significant fact being that expenditure was well below the amounts estimated at the beginning of the year. This was due to circumstances in the field which in part prevented the ICRC from fulfilling its intentions and executing its programmes, while the receipts were sufficient.

The efforts made by governments and National Societies in favour of the ICRC should be noted, while the latter, with the aid of the "Commission for the Financing of the ICRC", continued to carry out missions to many countries to seek their contributions.

With regard to contributions for the financing of specially financed operations, it has been mentioned above that they covered requirements.

For the ordinary account, it was only thanks to extraordinary gifts by private individuals that the ICRC was able to balance its 1983 accounts.

Although State contributions to the ordinary account were 40.6 million francs, as against 39.7 million in 1982, the ICRC cannot claim it was entirely satisfied, as there are still many governments that do not participate at all in the financing of the ICRC, or only very inadequately! Out of 155 States Parties to the Geneva Conventions, 86 approved, or promised, the payment of a contribution for 1983, and of these, 10 States accounted for 86 per cent of the total of 40.6 million francs.

Contributions from National Societies amounted to 2.96 million francs. Of the 131 recognized National Societies, 69 participated in the financing of the ICRC's ordinary account.

#### Audit

As in the previous three years, the ICRC's accounts were audited by the Société Fiduciaire Suisse, which recommended that the Committee approve the Balance Sheet and Accounts for 1983 (see letter, page 136). Furthermore, the ICRC has arranged for a systematic audit

Furthermore, the ICRC has arranged for a systematic audit of each of its specially financed operations by the international firm of auditors "PEAT MARWICK & MITCHELL". The firm checks the accounts for each operation, carrying out missions to the field to do so.

In accordance with the recommendation of the Eighth International Red Cross Conference, held in London in 1907, and with the decision of the Ninth Conference, held in Washington in 1912, a Fund was established by contributions from National Red Cross Societies. The regulations were revised by the Eighteenth International Red Cross Conference, held in Toronto in 1952.

#### **OBJECT**

The Fund's income is used to distribute a medal, called the "Florence Nightingale Medal", to honour the life and work of Florence Nightingale. The medal may be awarded to Red Cross nurses and voluntary aids for having distinguished themselves by their service to sick and wounded in time of peace or war.

The medal is awarded every two years by the ICRC on proposals made to it by the National Societies.

Statutory auditors' report to the Assembly of the

INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE RED CROSS, GENEVA

Ladies and Gentlemen,

As statutory auditors of your Institution, we have examined the accounts for the year ended 31 December 1983.

We have come to the conclusion that

- the balance sheet and the statement of income are in agreement with the accounting records,
- the accounting records have been properly kept,
- the balance sheet totalling Sw.Fr. 91.541.799,00 and the annual statement of income showing, after various complementary charges of Sw.Fr. 1.800.000,00, an excess of income over expenditure in the amount of Sw.Fr. 22.204,00, after taking account of the matter set out in the following paragraph, present fairly the financial position as at 31 December 1983 and the result of financial operations for the year then ended.

In addition to the above-mentionned complementary charges, an amount of Sw.Fr. 3.000.000 relating to gifts and legacies not foreseen for the ordinary budget in 1983, has been carried forward to be used to cover the financing of the 1984 ordinary budget.

In contrast to 1982, the annual income statement includes a supplementary column which sets out the gifts in kind or of services received by the ICRC during the year for its special actions (extraordinary budgets). This consists of statistical information not recorded in the books of account, which has been evaluated on the basis of costs and hourly tarifs estimated by the donors or, failing this, by the ICRC, in respect of which we have not carried out any verification.

Based upon our examination, we recommend that the accounts submitted to you be approved.
