The Sauropterygian *Ceresiosaurus calcagnii*, with a length of 2.30 m, from the lower Meride Formation is one of the most interesting fossils from the Middle Triassic of Monte San Giorgio. The thin bedded limestone contains another seven skeletons of 20 to 30 cm length from adult pachypleurosaurs *Neusticosaurus pusillus* (Foto Palaeontological Institut and Museum of University, Zürich).
