Written by Jesuits in Poland:
A Supplement to Lohr's <Latin Aristotle Commentaries>

The following text is conceived as a supplement to Charles H. Lohr's repertorium: *Latin Aristotle Commentaries: II. Renaissance Authors* (Florence 1988). Lohr's work contains some Polish Jesuit entries, but many entries are missing. The supplement enumerates the Latin Aristotle commentaries composed between 1500 and 1650 by the Jesuits in Poland and Lithuania (in that period constituting a confederation of those two nations) or related to Poland (see v.g. Rugerius, Sobolius). In the description of the entries I have followed the principles and rules adopted by Lohr.

The entries for the sixteenth century are essentially complete, for I thoroughly investigated this field for my *Filozofia w szkołach jezuickich w Polsce w XVI wieku* (The Philosophy in the Jesuit Schools in Poland in the Sixteenth Century). The entries for the seventeenth century are less complete – only those I had in my collections are mentioned. Almost all the commentaries were written in the connection with the teaching of philosophy in the schools noted.
