SUNDRY NEWS FROM SWITZERLAND.

The second financial plan presented to Parliament by the Federal Council foresees economies and new receipts. It has created a good impression inasmuch as it expresses the firm will of the Government to carry forward to success the effort of rendering wholesome the Federal finances.

Among the Swiss export industries, it is to be noted that the watchmaking industry, severely affected by the crisis up to 1933, shows a marked renewal of activity. The chemical and machine industries have found new foreign markets.

The 11th Olympic Committee has decided to accept only "Omega" chronometers for the official time-keeping during the Olympic games to be held in Berlin in 1936. The "Omega" chronometer holds the World's record for accuracy, which was established in 1933 at the Observatory of Teddington, England.
