MORE ABOUT SWITZERLAND FOR THE SWISS.

It can hardly be said that this movement to preserve the independence of our country is in any way political. It is a more or less necessary initiative born of genuine patriotism to counteract some nefarious movements to sell our country to foreign powers.

Well known Swiss citizens who have previously held prominent public positions have come under suspicion and some have even been arrested for fostering foreign propaganda. Dr. Eugen Wildi of Zofingen, a very well known solicitor, who had for many years enjoyed the high esteem of the community, has been found to be actively connected with National Socialism. The Cantonal police authorities of St. Gall have also ordered a general search of the house of Arnold Mettler-Specker of St. Gall, the result of which has not yet been made public. Mettler, who is 71 years of age, is said to be a multi-millionaire. With the Inspector of Police Kappeler who, like Mettler was reputed to be very well disposed towards Germany, he attended the great Nazi Congress at Nuremberg. He is also interested in the very pro-german paper "Neue Basler Zeitung" on which he is supposed to spend about 30,000 frs. a year. He is also suspected of supporting various papers of similar character. A son of Mettler has lately gone through a Nazi course for Leaders.

In Italy, where freedom of press is not known, articles referring to the three Italian speaking cantons of Switzerland Tessin, Wallis and Graubünden, as Italian territory are undisputably published.

Some time ago proceedings in a large theft case have brought to light the fact that a certain business dealing in fruit employed 15 men of which 11 were foreigners, mostly chaffeurs and storemen. Surely there is plenty "Swiss labour" offering to avoid such a state of affairs in our country.

It is stated that Dr. Bertheau, a well known barrister of Zurich, has refused to take over the defence of four Swiss Nazis who were arrested in St. Gall.
