NEWS IN BRIEF.

SUGARBEET AND BARLEY:

During 1939 Eastern Switzerland has, for the first time, gone in for extensive cultivation of sugar beet and barley. The cantons of Zurich, Thurgau, Aargau, Schaffhausen and St. Gall with 862 growers delivered 120,000 cwt. to the sugar factory.

For the advancement of the cultivation of Brewers barley in Switzerland a "Swiss Brewers Barley Commission" has been established with Federal Councillor Oehninger in the chair, representing the Farmers Breweries and Malt Factories.

THE DANGER OF THE POTATO BEETLE:

It has been ascertained that during 1939 the potato beetle had invaded 1496 boroughs in Switzerland with a total of 29,300 cases, that is ten times the number of the previous year. Again, the first discoveries of this beetle were made amongst imported seed potatoes. Their first appearance occurred in May, followed by a heavy increase in June and July.

DEFENCE LOAN 1940:

The $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4% Defence Loan of 200 Million Swiss francs has been over-subscribed by 20 Million francs.

OUR KNITTING BEE.

It can hardly be expected to report progress yet of our knitting scheme, but we have already proof that the idea has struck root.

Knitting is an art very familiar to our Swiss women. Their handling of the needles is very different from the Colonial way, and denotes much more speed. Thanks to this fact, we have great hopes for good results. There may be a few, a very few indeed, who are not conversant with knitting; but even they can assist by buying the material and passing it on to a willing and experienced worker.

It is well understood that the knitted articles are intended not only for the Swiss soldiers, but also for the families of "Bergler" who are in need of winter clothing. So, besides socks, balaclavas and scarves, other apparel, especially for children, would also be very welcome.

Please help us to the best of your ability to make this scheme a success. The more you send to Mrs. W. Schmid, c/o. the Consulate of Switzerland, the better she will be pleased.
