up business in Lyell, then a flourishing gold mining township, in the Buller Gorge. However, in 1898, a disastrous fire destroyed the late Mr. Carmine's and the majority of the other business premises in the Lyell township and he removed to Westport.

Mr. Carmine took up residence in Takaka fifteen years ago, one of his seven sons, the Rev. Father E.J. Carmine, being parish priest at the church of the Sacred Heart, Takaka, at that time. Although the deceased, particularly of late years, was of a somewhat retiring disposition, he was nevertheless quite a well-known figure in the Takaka district. His wife predeceased him in Nelson thirty-six years ago.

Surviving members of the family are Messrs. J.P. Carmine (Takaka), C.A. Carmine (Masterton), J.F.L. Carmine (Paeroa), L.V. Carmine (Wellington), J.F. Carmine (Nelson), the Rev. F.J. Carmine (parish priest, Pungarehu, Taranaki) and the Rev. P.A. Carmine (parish priest, South Broken Hill, New South Wales). Two daughters died some years ago.
