On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, butcher shops are closed. Restaurants are obliged to reduce and to remodel their menus. Eggs are very severely rationed and are allowed two eggs a person per month. The price of eggs is 35 cts. each. The greatest trouble of all is fuel, that is wood and coal especially, so as even the electric current must be used sparingly. It is very fortunate for our country that most of the railways are being run by electricity. Benzine is only for medical men and the police. Others have to contend with substitutes.

One of the few things we are blessed with abundantly is the great variety of taxes. The money value is very low. Savings Banks pay not more than $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ and interest from mortgages does not exceed $3\frac{1}{2}\%$."
