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FOOD PARCELS FOR SWITZERLAND.

The Swiss Consulate is informed by the Post and Telegraph Department at Wellington that the parcel post service to Switzerland has been resumed.

Gift parcels are limited to a maximum gross weight of 5 lbs. each, and in respect of those containing foodstuffs, the weight of any one commodity must not exceed 2 lbs. Moreover postings to any one address must not be made more frequently than once monthly.

Two customs declarations and a dispatch note in the French language must accompany each parcel. The declarations and dispatch notes are available at all post offices.

The Swiss Consulate will mail a circular letter to Swiss citizens whose addresses are available at the Consulate, giving them additional information, and advice as regards the filling in of the dispatch note.

OBITUARY.
