IN SWISS COMMUNITY.

A wedding of much interest to the Swiss Community in Wellington was solemnized at St. Mary of the Angels recently, when Miss Annette Cassidy plighted troth to Louis Hofer. The bride, who was escorted by her father, was beautifully gowned in a low waisted frock of embossed cream satin which introduced a most unusual note in its quilted sleeves and hem line. Her veil of billowy tulle was held in place by an attractive coronet of white feathers, and she carried a bouquet of cream roses and lily of the valley. Mrs. J. C. Sullivan, who was Matron of Honour, wore a frock of white georgette patterned in shades of cyclamen and she carried a bouquet of stock and cyclamen to tone. After the ceremony a reception was held at the home of Mrs. G. M. Cattin, Island Bay. The Hostess received her guests wearing a lime shaded house ensemble with black accessories.
