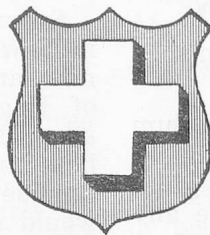

## REPORT OF THE SWISS SOCIETY

The Swiss Society held a meeting on the 28th of September, 1957, at Dr. Kaegi's residence.

The President, Mr. W. Risi, welcomed the committee. The Secretary, Mr. A. Biland, read the minutes from the last meeting. A lively discussion followed in respect of the Society's financial position, it may be of great interest to us all to know that, according to the report of our new treasurer, Mr. T. Loetscher, more than £300 subscriptions are unpaid and in arrears. Owing to these circumstances the last year's financial accounts showed a surplus of expenditure over income. This was also a reason why the annual subscription was increased to £1.

The Society consists of more than 350 members. Provided that all arrears and all future annual subscriptions would be paid promptly it is considered that the annual membership fee could be reduced considerably even below the previous 15/-.

Another interesting discussion followed in connection with the "Helvetia", to make our Swiss paper more interesting we have now a press committee and they have already done a great job. —O.F.
