* RECIPE

BRUNSLI

(an old Christmas speciality from Basle)

Take two egg whites, 2 tablesp. "Kirsch," 7oz sugar, ½lb grated chocolate, 1lb unpeeled grated almonds.

Whip egg white stiffly, add Kirsch and sugar, then chocolate and almonds. It must be firm dough and needed well on kneeding board. From dough a good quarter-inch thick cut the usual shapes of hearts and stars. Set on greased tray and bake in slow heat.
