Obituary

MR JACK BASLER

On Friday, September 3rd, Jack Basler, aged 79, of Auckland, passed away after a short illness in hospital.

Jack Basler, born in Riehen, Baseland, arrived in New Zealand in 1911 and worked for the first three years on "Schlaepfer's" farm in Pukekohe. Later on during the depression he worked as bricklayer on various jobs in the King Country.

In 1962/63 he went home for a trip to see his two sisters. Not long after his return he suffered a stroke and had to be transferred to hospital, where he improved gradually but a second stroke deteriorated his health rapidly.

Jack Basler will always be remembered as a good supporter of the Swiss Club; he loved the children in particular and always had an open hand for them.

We extend our deepest sympathy to his relatives in Switzerland.
