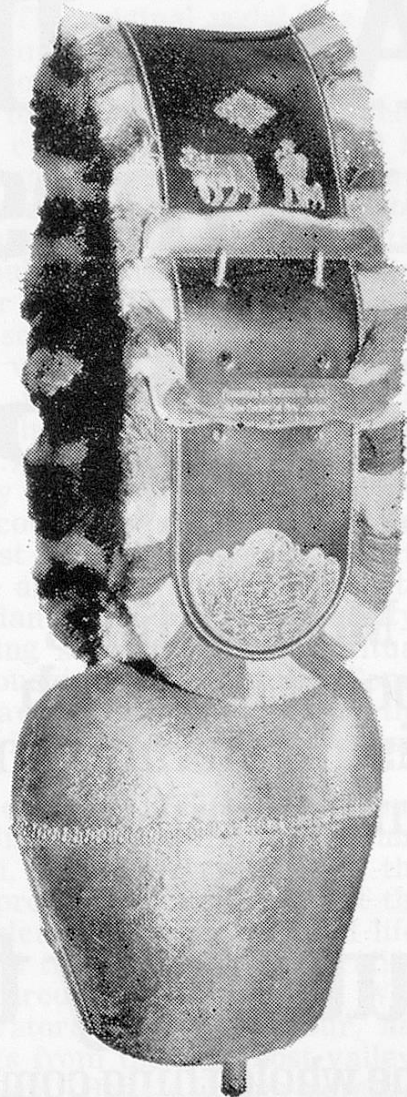
From each Club there will be four entrants for each event. I have left it to the discretion of your President and committees whether to choose the four best in each event, or the four best all-rounders to compete in each event.
