**Mrs Josepha Kaiser-Zimmermann**  
1904-1992

Mrs Josi Kaiser died at Hawera at a grand old age of 88 years. She was born at Ennetbürgen into a family of 12. A very well known Member of the Swiss community, she emigrated to New Zealand in 1920 to join her two brothers.

In 1925 she married Joe Kaiser at Manaia. They started farming at Inaha Road, then at the Palmer Road. In 1952 they purchased the farm at the Auroa Road. In 1960 they sold the farm to their son and then purchased a farmlet in Hawera. Josi always had an open house for new emigrants until they could find a job. She loved the Swiss cards, so they were played many times until the early hours in the morning with a few coffee Schnaps. Mrs Kaiser was a lady of trust, understanding and straight forward in her doing. She is survived by her son Joe, daughter Josi, 15 grand-children and many great-grand-children. R.D.
