Note: Where no dates or results are mentioned, the initiative has not yet been voted on by the citizens.

SUMMARY

The results of these 193 initiatives (including the two which did not have a number) were as follows:

- 8 were accepted without counter-proposals
- 83 were rejected without counter-proposals
- 2 were accepted with counter-proposals rejected
- 6 were rejected but counter-proposals were accepted
- 5 were rejected with counter-proposals being rejected too
- 11 were recalled for the benefit of counter-proposals which were accepted
- 2 were recalled for the benefit of counter-proposals which were also rejected
- 47 were withdrawn without a vote being taken
- 2 were declared invalid
- 21 are still pending
- 3 were written off
- 3 did not get off the ground at all

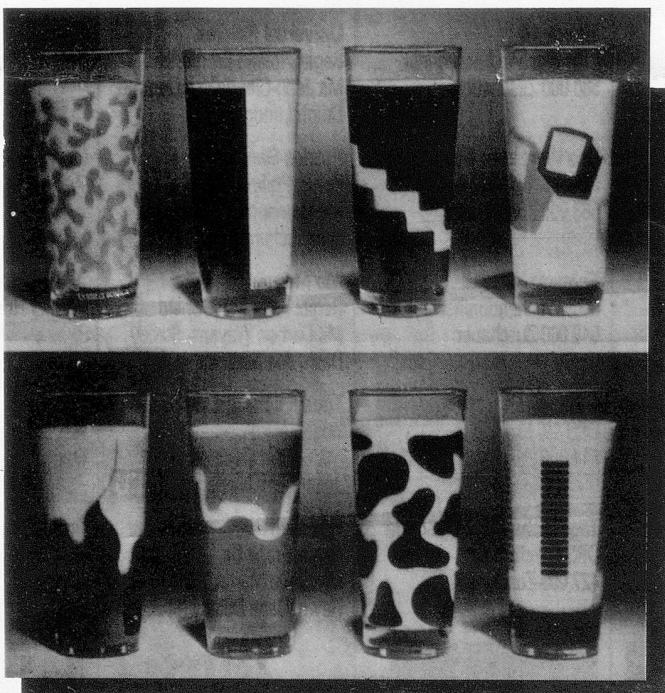
The most interesting fact is that most initiatives (137) were either rejected or withdrawn. *Only 27 were finally accepted in one form or another.*

Initiative No. 36 (Pressefreiheit) holds a record. It stayed in limbo for a full 42 years because it contained no cancellation clause. Since, by 1978, no one was interested in it any more, it was simply written off.

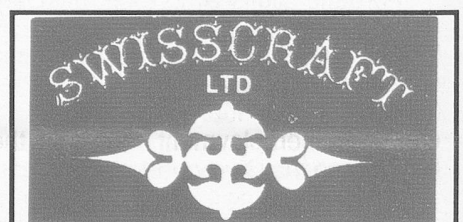
Despite the low acceptance rate, people's initiatives play an important part in Swiss politics since they bring up for general discussion matters of national interest. They also ensure that the Swiss citizens can never claim that they have not been consulted on any important issues concerning their lives.

The Editor trusts that you enjoyed going through these initiatives and that some of them may have revived in you a few good (or perhaps bad) memories from the past.
