

The Land Transport Safety Authority is concerned about safety on the roads especially tourists and new immigrants not familiar with NZ conditions.

I just mention the rule for new immigrants in short. If you have held a driving licence before and are over the age of 25 years, you only need to take the Practical Test to gain a NZ Driving Licence.

To take a practical test is straight forward:

- Go to your nearest Licence Issuing Office and arrange a time for your practical test.
- Return at the arranged time:
 - with a suitable vehicle
 - with your Learner's Licence (if applicable)
 - be prepared to have an officer with you in the car testing your driving standard, skills and attitude.

If you want a copy of the comprehensive leaflet call tollfree 0800-699 000.

The other option: Take your test in Bombay. 2 minutes driving on a disused road. Voilà - it is so simple.
