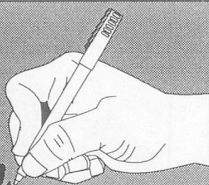

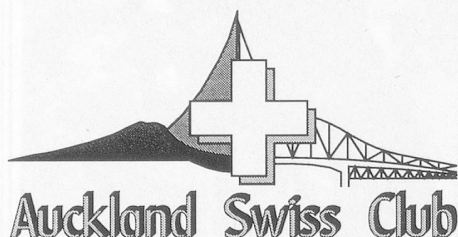

Dear Theres (Swiss Club members)

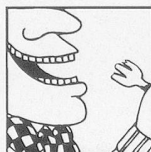

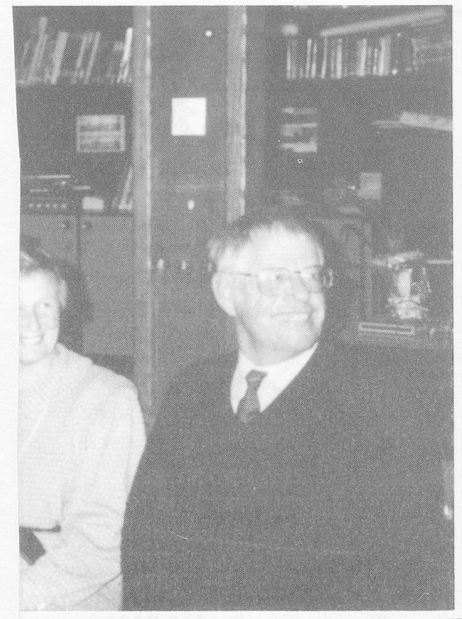
Schleicher's speech too gave value on a more serious note to our esteemed and prized Patrons.

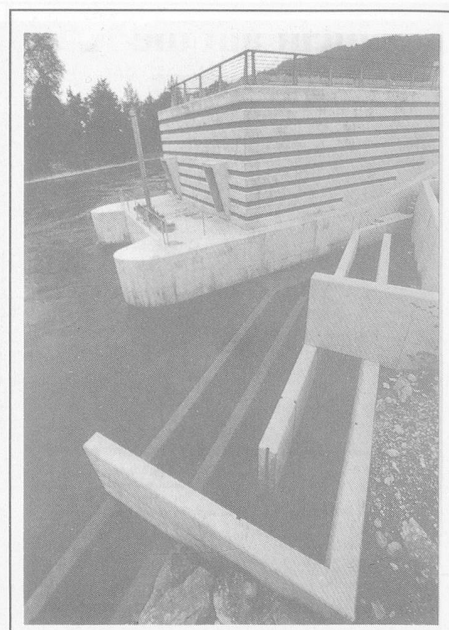
SNIPPETS

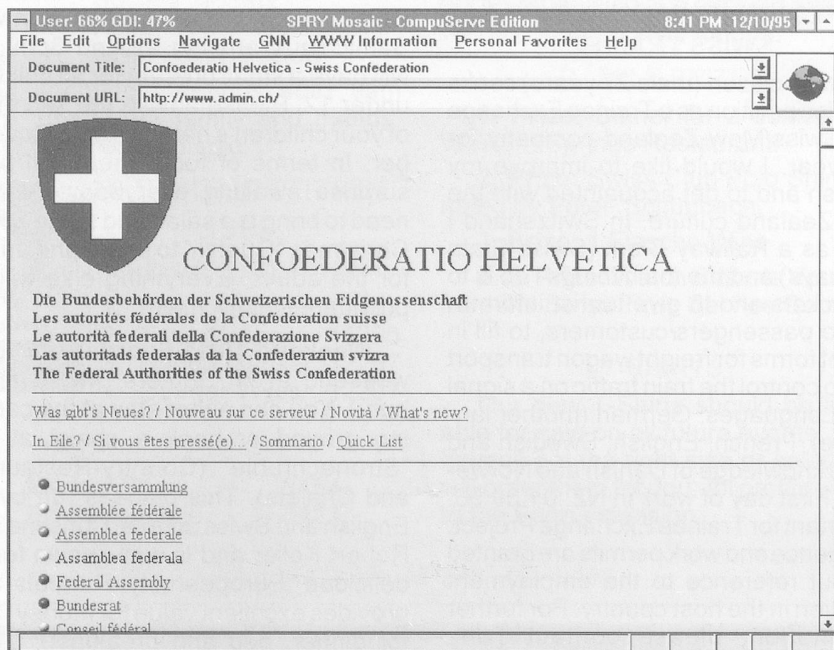
