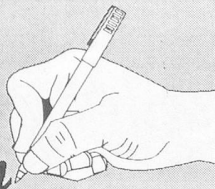

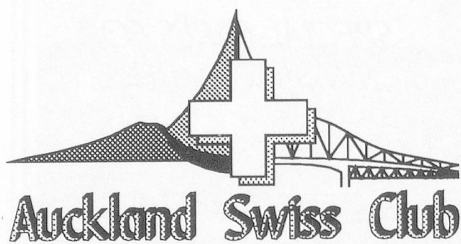

Two fondue forks were left behind so please check if they belong to you. To claim them ring Annegret at home 846-0736.

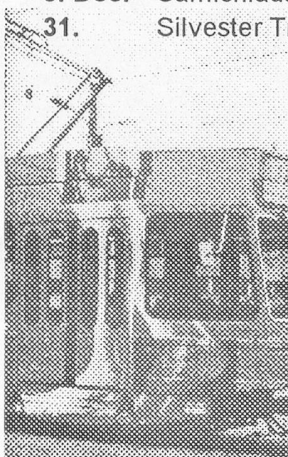

OVERALL STATISTICS

The number of medals awarded, compared to the number of medal placings, differs because several competitors have won a medal in more than one sports event, and this is denoted by a star on the medal presented.

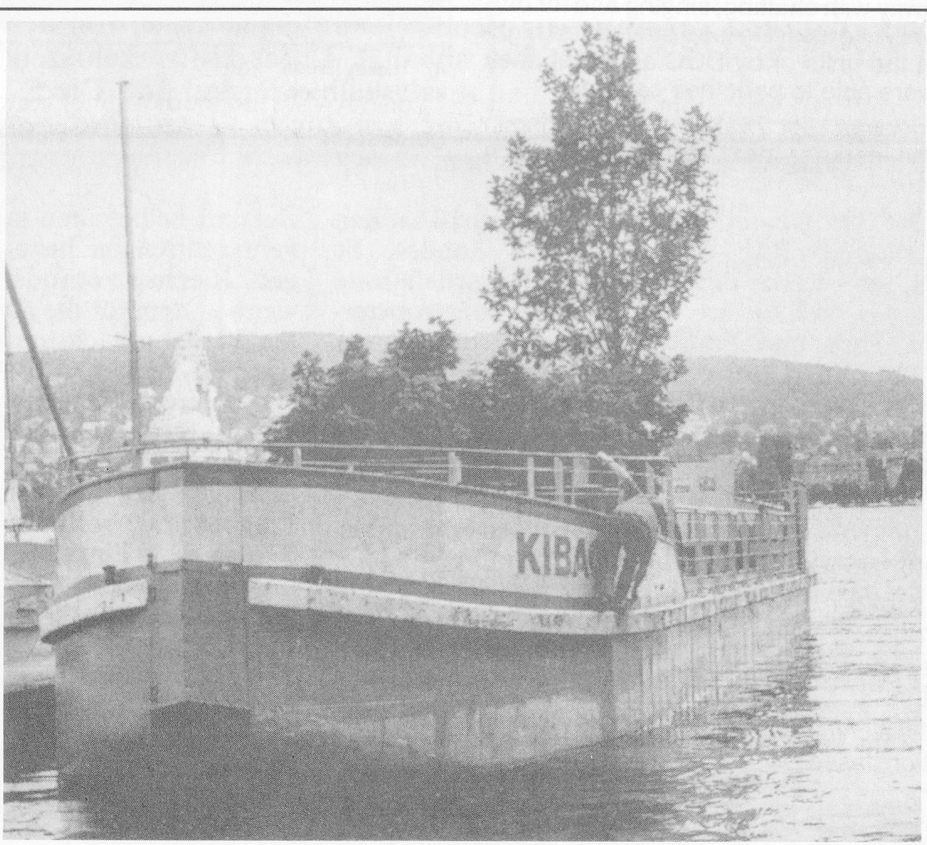
