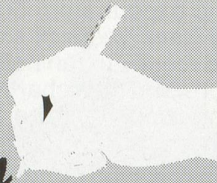

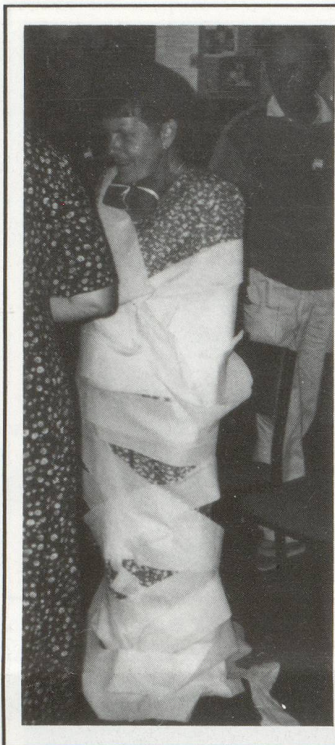

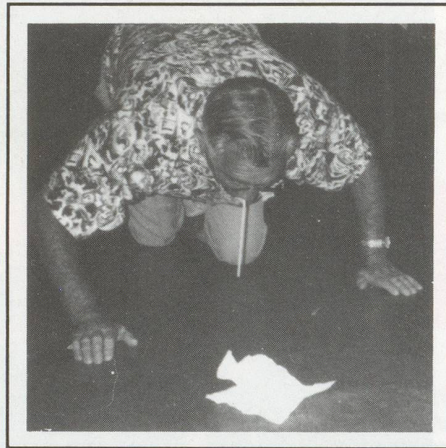


Games organised at night

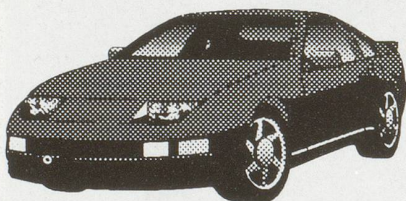

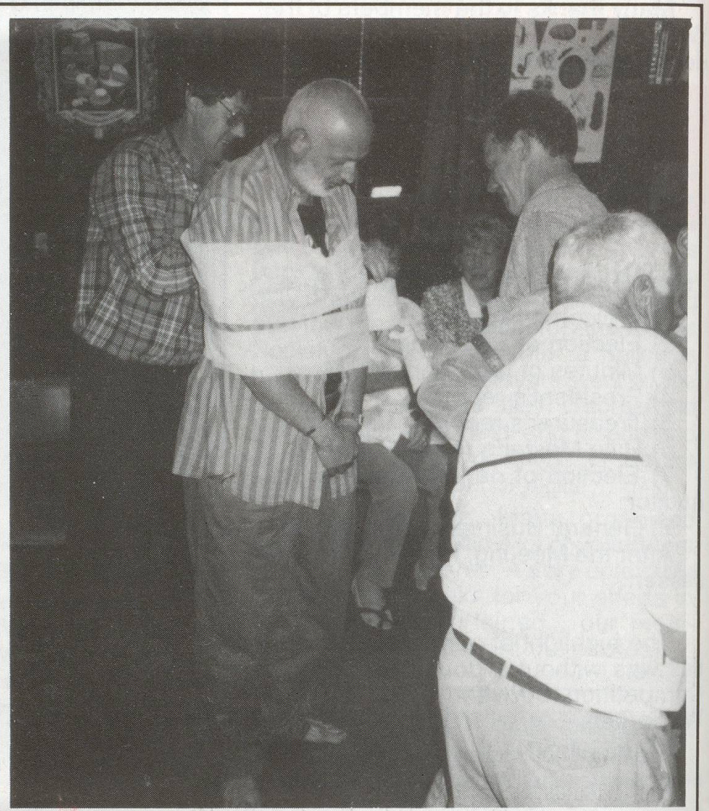
The next day Lina and Ivan Southerland spoil the guests with open-
