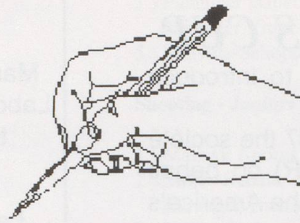

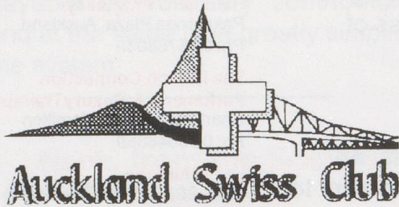

venue and helped bring the country

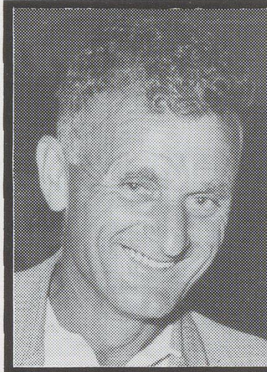
of our origin a little closer on the

Our one and only Joe Weber was born on 20. July 1919
at Arth, Canton of Schwyz, Switzerland, in the shadow
of Rigi mountain. - He died after a long battle with
Alzheimer's illness at Hamilton, on our National Day, 1.
August 1997.

- Joe came to NewZealand as a 33 year old, after
having been employed by the Rigi mountain railway for
a good number of years. His qualities as an excellent
farm worker were soon recognised by Willy Müller, his
Brother-in-law and John Villiger, husband-to-be of his
Niece Violanta, giving him employment on a farm at
Hinuera for the first year of his life in the adopted
Country. Joe spent the next 9 years with John Villiger,
sharemilking at Springdale and it was during those
years that Joe also worked for a period on the portable
saw mill of John Stucki. The next 25 years saw Joe as
part of the "John Villiger family farm enterprise" at
Kiwitahi, near Morrinsville. Little wonder that Joe be-
came a much loved Uncle to the Villiger Children and
an integral part of the family.

- Joe's Requiem Mass to celebrate his life in the
Catholic Church of Morrinsville was attended by Family
and lots of Swiss friends.

- Joe was a down-to-earth Swiss-Kiwi. He will be re-
membered as a humble character fond of socialising,
preferably with a good deck of Swiss cards, his pipe
filled with his favourite tobacco, a can of beer or two
and if possible a "Bratwurst" followed by "Coffee with
fortification".

- The families of the late Joe Weber and the Swiss
Community of the Waikato have lost a warm hearted
identity! Our sympathy goes to his Brother and Sister in
Switzerland and to the Müller and Villiger families in
Morrinsville.

In 1959 he married Martha and together they started sharemilking on the Duthy Rd. Kaponga. In 1970 they sold the herd and went to live in New Plymouth.

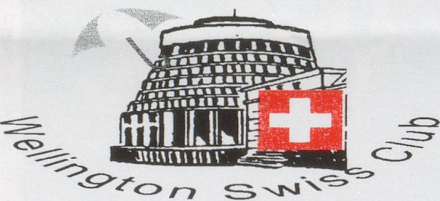
- As a active member of the Taranaki Swiss Club and the Swiss Society he was a real "Innerschwitzer".

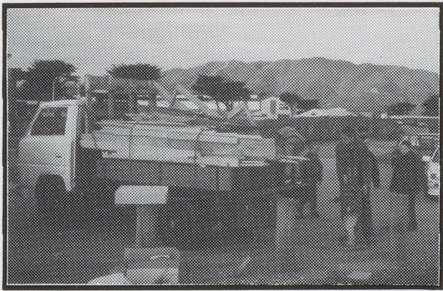
