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

Do you know the name of this Swiss holiday destination ?

The town in question is but a short distance from Lugano, Lake Maggiore, Como and the tourist and industrial centres of northern Italy. It is part of the railway connection, the second station from Chiasso to Lugano. Its name contains 9 letters and starts with the letter 'M'. - Cultural/religious events in this town are the historic Maundy-Thursday and Good Friday processions. The Maundy-Thursday procession depicts the way of Christ to Calvary. The Good Friday procession is of an austere devout and solemn nature. - On foot from the Restaurant Funivia Serpiano, you can reach the Alp of Brusino in less than 30 minutes on an easy path. Of particular interest are the thousand-year old chestnut trees with their enormous trunks which are completely hollow. A short distance from this town we find the mountain 'Monte Generoso' (1701 m) with magnificent panorama view; a cog-wheel railway leading to the top. Here a system of trails provides interesting walks, or the tourist may visit the observatory.
