



Kurt Robert Suter (1908-2004) Life Member

Christchurch Swiss Club

With real regret we extend our sympathy to Evelyn and Wendy, Bon and Lindsay on the death of their beloved husband and father.

Kurt was one of the foundation members of the Christchurch Swiss Club and has been an active driving force until poor health curbed his involvement.

Born in Wohlen in 1908, Kurt, at 20, emigrated firstly to Australia and in 1930 to the mountains in New Zealand.

He worked at the Hermitage (for no pay at first) guiding and building the mountain huts. In 1935 Kurt contracted to run the cookhouse at the Homer Tunnel construction site. Mt Suter in Fiordland is named after him as a commemoration of the effect of his time and efforts there.

In 1938, Kurt left to organise from Burma, a climbing expedition to South West China, Yunnan Province. Probably the last 'foreign' climbing group before the Communists took over and closed the borders.

At war outbreak, Kurt returned quickly to New Zealand, joining the Air Force, but still fitting in climbing and shooting.

In 1943 Evelyn and Kurt married in Dunedin and went poultry farming, firstly in Oamaru, before moving to Banks Peninsula, bringing up the family and farming sheep.

Retiring to Christchurch in 1967, Evelyn and Kurt kept 5 acres - the 'Swiss Chalet' in Akaroa where for 23 years many Swiss Club weekends, picnics and BBQs (including the famous Swiss Navy visit) were held. Kurt helped organise 'feasts' for many August 1sts.

Kurt died on January 10, 2004 aged 96. A great, modest man to the last. He had a rare energy and enthusiasm for life.

We will miss him.

Three typical Swiss Sports

There are three typically Swiss sports - Schwingen, Hornussen and Steinstossen.

-Schwingen ("swinging") is a form of wrestling in which the contestants seek to throw one another by grasping the short trousers of coarse linen which they wear.

-In Hornussen one team, the "strikers" (Schlager) are equipped with long (2 metre - 7 feet) flexible clubs with hardwood heads, with which they drive the Hornus, a disk the size of a man's hand, as far down the field as they can. The object of the defenders (Abtuer) is to catch the disk before it reaches the ground with their large wooden bats.

-In Steinstossen ("tossing the stone") the object is to throw a large stone weighing 83.50kg (184 pounds) as far as possible; the record stands at about 3.50 metres (11 feet).

Handgliding - this new sport has become increasingly popular in Switzerland in recent years. There are many handgliding schools.

Climbing - Switzerland is the classic country for mountaineering, which has become increasingly popular as a sport since the middle of the 19th century, when it was pioneered by British climbers at Zermatt. The Swiss Alpine Club, founded in 1863, has built up a network of paths and huts to facilitate access to the mountains; and the central Alps, with numerous peaks rising to over 4000 metres (13,124 feet), offer the most magnificent glacier walks and climbs in the whole of the Alps. There are a number of excellently run climbing schools in Switzerland, providing instruction both for beginners and for those who want to learn specialised techniques. In most schools it is also possible to obtain guides.
