the backpacker tourists

The backpacker tourists in Switzerland are being a little neglected. A study by the university of Lausanne felt that there would be a reasonable potential to be gained from the tourists with smaller budgets. The organisation Swiss Backpackers found 21 businesses who have specialised in backpacker tourism. These tourists have an average age of 26, speak english and are students. In Icehockey general they stay in Switzerland for approximately two weeks and spend about 90 francs per day.

Now, isn't that committment to your team!!! There were 4,800 spectators watching this match. Basel bet Grasshoppers (Zurich) 4-1 played at St-Jakob-Park under the watchful eyes of 21,078 spectators.
