



In the late 1980s John bought a house in Manaia to be close to his special friends, John and Helena Mulligan, and became a very active member of the Taranaki Swiss Club. John was always first to arrive at Keglen, and euchre was one of his favourite pastimes. It was while playing a game of euchre

that John had a bad turn and never recovered.

John had no family in
New Zealand, but his
neighbours, the Mulligans
and the members of the Swiss
Club were his extended family.
John was the New Zealand
grandfather to many Swiss
children, who showed their
sadness on the day
of his farewell.

To his family in Switzerland, and his close friends in New Zealand, the Taranaki Swiss Club extends their deepest sympathy.


