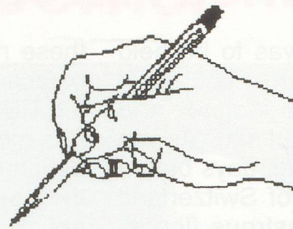

though the skies were slightly overcast. Before hitting the trail, the walkers had to pass the electronic gate to cross into the Northern enclosure of the Maungatautari Ecological Island. Here a trust has fenced off an area of forest to protect endangered native birds from the omnipresent pests like possums and rats. Currently, there are two smaller enclosures, one on the North side, the other one on the South side of Maungatautari mountain but as one could see, work for the 47 km totally pest-proof fence around the whole forest on Maungatautari is well under way. There are two loop tracks in the enclosure and many Swiss walkers tackled both of them. Some feeding stations allowed an easy observation of birds (if the bird watcher keeps quiet!). Returning to the cars, it was time for lunch before all headed homewards. 



Sunday 29th January 2006 Shotput and Family Fun Day.

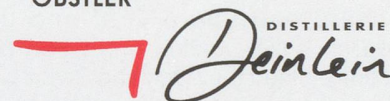

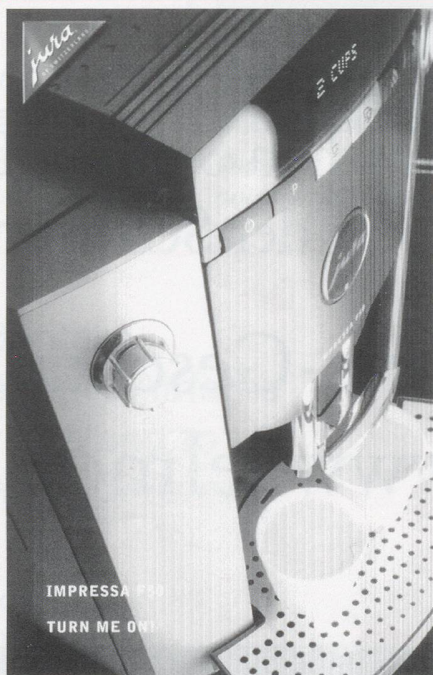
