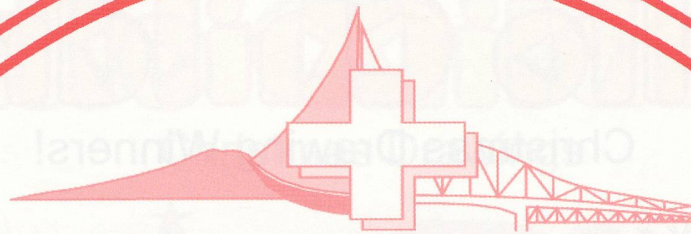

50-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

The Auckland Swiss Club is proud to announce 50 years of existence as a club this year, and we have planned a few special events to celebrate this anniversary. In the next few months we would like to present a little overview of the Auckland Swiss Club, its members and its idiosyncrasies.

The club has its beginnings before the second World War when a group of Swiss Immigrants had regular gatherings and managed a communal fund to finance these.

In the late forties this group disintegrated and it wasn't until 1953 when Max Bachmann took residence in Blockhouse Bay, that unofficially Swiss immigrants started to congregate again. His house served as a meeting place, a safe haven, a place to get together for a game of cards, a childminding place or a right old chinwag venue for the fresh immigrants.

He made a special meal of "Sauerkraut and Schübli" for the 1st August that year.

On 3rd November 1956, Max Bachmann called the first General meeting for the official foundation of the new club to which he served as the first President.

Doris Binder was appointed secretary, Toni Sidler Vice president and Arthur Müller Treasurer.

Many keen members were part of this committee.

On the occasion Tony Peyer, Doris Binder's father, presented the club with 56 pounds as a founding donation from the pre-war club.

Since many Swiss arrived at that time by each boat that passed by the Auckland and Wellington port, the club quickly grew and its activities became more and more lively. Official venues were used for the regular gatherings in and around the Mt. Eden area, or at people's houses, as for the picnic in 1957 which took place at Dr. Ferdy Kägi's farm on the Bombay Hills...
