





E-voting

The Confederation and cantons have already had positive results with voting on the Internet. E-voting is secure and reliable. In autumn 2011, about 22,000 Swiss citizens living abroad will be able to cast their vote electronically in elections to the National Council.

On 22 June this year the Federal Council approved applications submitted by the cantons of Aargau, Basel-Stadt, Grau-bünden and St. Gallen to be able to use this system.

E-voting makes it easier for Swiss living abroad to exercise their political rights, and it eliminates the risk of a ballot paper being incorrectly filled in or arriving too late.

This first online election may well attract the attention of other European countries. Switzerland and Estonia are currently the only countries which allow their citizens to cast their vote on the Internet. In the autumn of this year, Norway will carry out pilot tests in e-voting; other countries have abandoned the idea for political and/or technical reasons.

Delegate of the Swiss Abroad Report

Mani Züst will represent New Zealand at the 88th Auslandschweizerkongress in Lugano, 20th – 22nd August. People can vote in English now, but the debate is still in German and French.

If you are registered to vote in Switzerland, eight cantons have now adopted e-voting: NE, GE, BS, SG, AG, SH, SO, TG, and some communes of ZH, GR, LU, FR.

There is an Internet Platform, Swiss community.org, where you can register and communicate with Swiss from all over the world. Over 4000 people have signed in sofar.

The Swiss Abroad, mainly in America, are concerned about a problem with Swiss banks. They have to pay to have a bank account in Switzerland now, because of regulations in America towards the Swiss banks.

Last year over 300 children from 30 states all over the world were on camps organized by ASO. A further 60 young people were billeted with Swiss families to experience Swiss culture. The Swiss Army had 40 recruits from abroad.

From this year on, the Swiss Review will be sent to all households in only one copy per household - which will save SFr 30'000. Othmar Hebler
