Due to the fact that I needed more space in the hut and the fact that the bunks were hardly used except by the spiders and mice I made the decision to break it down. Ernst and Andre helped me to reorganize and streamline the facility including a tea and coffee bay.

Andre, Daniel, Ernst, Othmar and I replaced the target number posts. It was a great day of teamwork and after a full day of digging, concreting and nailing, the new post stood firmly in the ground and we could look at our great achievement with pride.

After a heavy rainstorm I found some wet spots on the floor in the shooting hut. The outcome of this is that all the lead-head nails were replaced by screws. During this work that was instrumented by our roofing leader Martin and helpers: Ernst, Daniel and I, we found that the roof of the hut needs some further attentions.

All in all I would like to thank all the working bee helpers for their time and commitment.

I am just about to leave for another working bee to the Swiss Shooting Range. Andre, Ernst, Andrew have thankfully announced to give me a hand in restoring the targets.

Over the years the increased shooting accuracy has really taken a toll on the targets and therefore need to be restored more frequently. We are also in the process of finding a more suitable product here in New-Zealand as the product used in Switzerland is quite expensive not to mention the transport costs and NZ duty, to top it all off.

PE90

There are now a few of us shooters that own a PE90. In the meantime the club has also bought one which is registered to Ernst Lanz. Some of us also own a PE57 but the legislation is still the same.

After careful considerations I personally came to the conclusion that PE90 are not very practical here in NZ. First they are of very high maintenance as cleaning them is paramount. Once they have ex-amount of rounds through the barrel they would need a complete overhaul. At the moment that would have to be undertaken in Switzerland. Not an easy task considering that one needs to get a NZ export permit as well a Swiss import permit. Then the rifle needs to be reconditioned and shipped back with export and import permits in reverse. Considering that a good PE90 will cost you way above 5K and with the accumulating costs of maintaining it, I therefore do not favor that option.

At present I am working through some other options to create some new rifles based on the GP90 cartridge. There are other options out there so we all can enjoy a good day at the range.
