
Past Events

Treasurer's Report (Sandrine Smith) from 31 March 2017

The accounts have been audited in May 2017. The Swiss Society of New Zealand has made a net profit of \$453 compared to \$567 for the year ending 2016. Six issues of the Helvetia were produced and sent out at an average cost of \$2,408 (last year \$2,421) per issue. The Society has approximately 588 paying members: Society only: 75; Auckland Club: 145 – incl. 4 honorary; Hamilton Club: 139 – incl. 7 honorary; Taranaki Club: 186 – incl. 1 honorary; Wellington Club: 59 - incl. 4 honorary. Total = 588 members.

Advertising revenue is \$500 lower than the previous year. This is due to some misunderstanding which has now been addressed. All account receivables and payables have been paid for the year ending 2017. Accumulated funds increased from \$70,822 in the prior year to \$71,376 in the current year.
