**Christophe Girot** studied environmental planning and management at the University of California and landscape architecture at the University of California in Berkeley. He has been Professor at the Chair of Landscape Architecture at the ETH Zurich since 2001, after having taught as a visiting professor in 1999 and 2001. In addition to his academic activities, Christophe Girot is a practicing landscape architect and owner of Atelier Girot in Zurich.

**Sébastien Marot** studied philosophy at the University of Paris IV-Sorbonne and is a critic of architecture and landscape. Since 2007 he has been a Guest Professor at the Chair of Landscape Architecture at the ETH Zurich. Head manager of the Société Française des Architectes since 1986, he founded the Tribunes d'histoire et d'actualité de l'architecture in 1987 and the journal Le Visiteur in 1995.

**Pia Fricker** studied architecture at University of Karlsruhe (D) and Technical University of Otaniemi (FIN) and specialized in CAAD CAM technologies at ETH Zurich. Since 2006, she has been teaching in as well as developing the MAS LA program at ETH and working as an architect in Zurich.

**Susanne Hofer** studied fine arts and film/video at the HdK Zurich. Since 2004 she has been developing and teaching the video modules for the MAS LA programme at the ETH Zurich. In parallel she works as a director, camerawoman, and scriptwriter. In 2003 she founded her own company firma flimmer with Katrin Oetli.

**Alexandre Kapellos** studied architecture at the EPF in Lausanne and CAAD CAM technologies at ETH Zurich. He has been teaching at the Chair of Landscape Architecture at ETH Zurich since 2005 and working as a freelance architect since 1999.

**James Melson** studied architecture at the University of Western Australia and later completed the MAS in Landscape Architecture at ETH Zurich. Since 2007 he has been teaching landscape design at the postgraduate level at the Chair for Landscape Design. Parallel to his work at the chair he works as a freelance landscape architect.

**Jacqueline Parish** studied landscape architecture at Heriot-Watt University in Edinburgh and Wageningen Agricultural University and spatial planning at ETH Zurich. She has been teaching in the MAS LA since 2002, and since 2007 she has been developing a new department for the Design of Public Spaces for the City of Zurich.

**Frédéric Rossano** graduated from Versailles School of Landscape Architecture in 1998. In 2001, he won the European 6 competition in Lyon and has been working ever since on urban projects. His practice covers a broad range of projects, from inner city renewals to regional planning in France and the Netherlands. Before teaching at the ETH, he led workshops and diploma projects in Lille, Versailles, and Delft.
